In accordance with the transition to the National Funding Formula (NFF), as outlined within Item 8 of Schools' Forum 20 October 2020, the recommendation for distributing the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) Schools Block in respect to mainstream schools and academies is required as follows:

Primary Lump Sum

Forum members will be aware of the phased transition for Primary schools to reflect the National Funding Formula (NFF) and where specifically the phased reduction of the Lump Sum has been applied. 2021/22 is the final year of transition and the lump sum will reduce by £2,200 to mirror the NFF Lump Sum for all sectors.

Forum should note that the reduction is lower than anticipated last year (£120,000 down to £115,000 = -£5,000) as the unit value has now increased to £117,800. The reduction is more than offset for all Primary schools given the increases to all other factors. The increased Minimum Funding Level (MFL) also protects all schools where any reduction to the Lump Sum may have impacted on them achieving the MFL in 2021/22.

RECOMMENDATION 1:

Schools' Forum recommend all the formula unit values for 2021/22 as per the tables above.

Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG)

The statutory guidance allows for Schools' Forum to consider applying an MFG to protect pupil level school funding at a rate between 0.5% and 2.00%. The rate was set for 2020/21 at 1.84% in line with recommended DfE inflationary protections. The DfE have recommended the MFG is set at 2.00% for 2021/22.

RECOMMENDATION 2:

Schools' Forum recommend the MFG protection is increased from 1.84% and set at 2.00% in line with DfE guidance.

b) De-Delegation

For Maintained Schools only, the formula mechanism contains options for schools to choose to de-delegate an amount from their formula allocation to contribute to Local Authority services that work to support them. Academies are able to buy back into any services directly.

The De-delegated options for consideration are shown below:

The introduction of the full (Hard) National Funding Formula (NFF) included the proposal to cease de-delegation and ensure all schools budgets are allocated in full to provide them with the autonomy to determine which services they may choose to buy back into. The hard NFF has now been delayed from 2021/22 until (expected) 2023/24. This means that Local Authorities and their Schools' Forum retain some freedoms to recommend which services may still be included in the de-delegation options.

The table provided is based on previous Schools' Forum considerations.

RECOMMENDATION 3:

Schools' Forum recommend the De-delegated values for 2021/22 as per the table above.

c) Headroom

After all formula factors have been updated as per the above recommendations and in accordance to the National Funding Formula unit values, there is a balance of DSG Schools Block that remains un-allocated. This balance is required to cover any outstanding updates to budget determinations as follows:

- October 2020 census variations Pupil numbers will be adjusted for in the final Schools Block determination, however any increases in funding required due to variances in pupil cohort characteristics need to be covered from any available headroom monies, for example if increased Deprivation funding is required once all up to date pupils have been mapped into their respective deprivation Super Output Areas.
- **Growth** where increased pupil intakes require additional classes to meet infant class size regulations, or to meet Basic Need requirements, funding needs to be either retained to fund in-year growth or estimated upfront within schools budget allocations where data is known about planned growth prior to the final budgets being determined and published.
- **Falling Rolls Fund** funding may be set aside from the Schools Block to create a small fund to support good schools with falling rolls, where local planning data shows that the surplus places will be needed within the next three financial years.
- **Business Rates** actual estimates for Business Rates are subject to change each year in line with rateable value reviews, revaluations of premises and inflation. These increases are not notified until January / February each year.
- Minimum funding Level (MFL) and Minimum Funding Guarantee (MFG) protections once all final data has been input there may be increased protections required on individual schools budgets to ensure their actual budget allocations comply with the MFL and MFG funding per-pupil levels and protections.

Schools Block transfer – if when all items above have been updated to reflect the actual individual schools budget determinations, and any amounts to support growth and falling rolls have been agreed, there remains a balance of unallocated Schools Block funding, the Local Authority respectfully requests Schools' Forum consideration to transfer this balance by way of supporting the deficit recovery on the High Needs Block.

Schools' Forum may recommend up to 0.5% transfer of Schools' Block without any disapplication process being required to be approved by the Secretary of State for Education. For information, 0.5% of Burys' 2021/22 Schools Block is £700,434. Currently there is around £560,000 unallocated on the indicative 2021/22 budget determinations but this will be significantly lower once all updated figures from the headings above are included.

RECOMMENDATION 4:

Schools' Forum recommends, in principle, a transfer of unallocated Schools Block Headroom to the High Needs Block. The amount to be agreed and confirmed at the meeting of Schools' Forum in January 2021.
