Bury Children's Strategic Partnership Board

Bury Children's Partnership brings together partners from a wide range of agencies to work together to help children and young people in Bury be the best that they can be; in particular those children and young people who for many different reasons face more barriers than their peers. Bury Children's Partnership arrangements are led by the Children's Strategic Partnership Board (CSPB), comprised of senior personnel from key partner organisations responsible for the wellbeing of children and young people.

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Bury Children & Young People's Plan 2021-24: Outcomes

'Let's Do It for Children & Young People 2021 – 24' is the overarching Bury Plan set by the CSPB for partners to work together to improve outcomes for children, young people and families. The Plan works towards a vision in the Bury 2030 Strategy for Bury to be "a place in which people are helped to make the best of themselves and where everyone can explore their dreams"

It sets out 5 Outcomes to give children and young people the best start in life:

- Children & Young People enjoy safe childhoods and are protected from harm
- Children & Young People have a good education and leave school with the best education outcomes and skills to succeed as adults and make a positive contribution
- Children & Young People live happy, healthy lives in their families and communities
- Children & Young People have fun growing up and are confident and resilient
- Children & Young People are active citizens who feel they have a voice and influence

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Bury Children & Young People's Plan – Priorities

The CSPB has brought together data and information from a range of sources to set Priorities under the Outcomes.

- We have a safeguarding system across the partnership to ensure ALL children are safe and secure
- Needs are identified and responded to at the earliest opportunity
- Person-centred and inclusive opportunities are accessible to all
- Rates of progress in learning improve for all, especially the most vulnerable
- Effective transition at key points leading to sustained engagement in learning and positive progression
- Children and young people get the support they need local to where they live
- Children and young people are physically and mentally healthy and active
- Services and systems work together to ensure all children get the best start in life
- We have a strong emotional wellbeing and mental health offer (THRIVE approach)
- Children and young people have access to extra-curricular activities and green spaces
- Children, young people and families help shape policy developments and services that affect them.



Bury Children's Partnership Board Sub Groups

The CSPB will drive forward the improvements to meet the priorities in 'Let's do it for children and young people', supported by a range of sub groups. These include the Starting Well & Early Help Board; the Strategic Education Board; the SEND Assurance Board and the Children's Heath & Care Recovery & Transformation Board. The CSPB works as part of a system of Boards that have a collective responsibility to deliver the changes and improvements set out in the Bury 2030 Strategy.

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Co-producing with children, young people and families

The CSPB is underpinned by a fundamental principle that we will co-produce our service improvements with children, young people and families. To formalise this commitment, the Board is signed up to 'the Promise' which sets out what co-production and meaningful engagement 'looks like' to children and young people . This will help the Board to drive forward a culture of co-production with accountability to children and young people supported by the CSPB Co-Production sub group.
