RAMPSIDE is in the borough and civil parish of Barrow. The village of Rampsid is on the southern shore of the peninsula of Furness and has a station on the London, Midland and Scottish railway, 11 miles south from Ulverston and 4 south-east from Barrow, in the union and county court district of Barrow-in-Furness, rural deanery of Dalton, archdeaconry of Furness and diocese of Carlisle. In December, 1887, the chapelry of Rampsid, formerly attached to Dalton-in-Furness, and within the civil parish of Dalton-in-Furness, was formed into the consolidated chapelry of St. Michael, Rampsid, and in 1897-8 was constituted a distinct ecclesiastical parish, including Piel Island. The church of St. Michael, standing on an eminence nearly a mile from the village, is a building of stone, rough cast, and consists of chancel (added in 1892), nave, south porch and an embattled western tower containing one bell: there are 270 sittings: a considerable addition to the already existing burying ground was made during the years 1889-90. The separate register dates from 1874 only; entries previous to that date are included in the Dalton register. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £275, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Dalton, and held since

1923 by the Rev. John William Adams M.A. of Jesus College, Oxford. The Parish Room was erected about 1890. The Duke of Buccleuch K.T. is lord of the manor. R. J. A. Clark esq. Lord Richard Cavendish P.C., C.B., C.M.G., D.L., J.P. and the London, Midland and Scottish Railway Co. are the principal landowners. The soil is clay and sand; subsoil, chiefly clay. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. The area and rateable value are included with that of Barrow. The population of the parish in 1911 was 439.

RAMSBOTTOM

RAMSBOTTOM is a populous manufacturing town on the river Irwell, with a station on the East Lancashire section of the London, Midland and Scottish railway, 4 miles north from Bury, 13½ north from Manchester, 4½ south from Haslingden, 8 south-west from Bacup, 8 south from Accrington and 7 north-east by road from Bolton-le-Moors; under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1894, it was formed into a civil parish, which comprises parts of the old townships of Elton, Holcombe, Tottington Higher End, Tottington Lower End and Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth; it is in the Heywood and Radcliffe division of the county, hundred of Salford, petty sessional division, union, county court district and rural deanery of Bury, archdeaconry of Rochdale and diocese of Manchester. A Local Board was constituted March 18, 1864, under the Act of 1858, consisting of 12 members; by the Act 46 and 47 Vict. dated 1883, the district was extended to its present area, but under the Local Government Act, 1894, the parish is now governed by an Urban District Council. The town is lighted with gas by a company. The ecclesiastical parish was formed June 3, 1844, from the civil parish of Bury. The church of St. Paul is a stone building in the Early English style, erected in 1850 at a cost of £3,400, and consists of chancel, nave, vestry, north aisle, south porch, organ chamber and a tower with spire containing 8 bells, hung in 1879 and recast in 1900: the organ was the gift of W. Grant esq.: memorial windows have been inserted to Viscount Palmerston, d. 18 October, 1865, W. Grant esq. of Nuttall, J. Heys esq. and others; and there is also a marble monument to J. Killer

esq. of Irwell Mount (1862): in 1866 an addition to the church, now called the Palmerston aisle, was made at a cost of £985: there are 780 sittings. The register dates from the year 1847. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £395, with residence, in the gift of the Crown and the Bishop of Manchester alternately, and held since 1923 by the Rev. H. T. R. Briggs. St. Andrew's is a consolidated chapelry, formed February 15, 1876, out of Ramsbottom and Holcombe parishes; the church, built in 1832-34 by William Grant esq. and transferred to the Church of England and consecrated in 1875, is an edifice of stone in the Gothic style, consisting of nave and a lofty tower with pinnacles, containing a clock and five bells: the east window is stained, and there are several monuments to the Grant family, and 350 sittings. The register dates from 1875. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £267, with residence, in the gift of the trustees of the late Sir John Grant Lawson bart. and held since 1922 by the Rev. David Lewtas B.A. of St. David's College, Lampeter. The parsonage was built in 1883.

St. Joseph's Roman Catholic church, erected in 1880 at a cost of £2,500, is a building in the Gothic style. The Presbyterian Church, in Dundee lane, Ramsbottom, dates from 1651, and is one of the oldest in England. The Baptist chapel, erected in 1851, has 600 sittings. Park Congregational chapel, built in 1798, has 450 sittings. The Wesleyan Methodist chapel, built in 1873, is of stone in the Italian style, and has sittings for 700 persons: the cost, including school rooms, was about £4,500. STUBBINS Congregational chapel, erected in

1865, at a cost of £8,000, is a building in the Gothic style, with a tower and spire 120 feet in height; a stained window was presented by James Porritt esq. J.P. and there is a memorial window to Mr. B. M. Porritt; there are 750 sittings. The Primitive Methodist chapel, erected in 1889, will seat about 550. The cemetery, at Hazelhurst, in the parish of Holcombe, covers 8 acres, and is under the control of the Ramsbottom Urban District Council. In 1922 the Chatterton playing fields were opened for public recreation; the ground was given and laid out by Lt.-Col. A. T. Porritt J.P. and placed under the control of the Urban District Council.

An annual fair is held here on the second Saturday in August. There are iron and brass foundries, machine factories and extensive calico printing, bleaching, spinning and manufacturing establishments. There is a Conservative Association and a Liberal Club; an Industrial and Provident Society with library and reading rooms, in Bolton street, and an Odd Fellows' Hall, erected in 1849. The Aitken Memorial and

Jubilee Cottage Hospital, in Nuttall lane, opened in 1900, is of red brick with stone dressings, and contains 10 beds.

The Clitheroe Estate Co. Limited are lords of the manor, and the trustees of the late Sir John Grant Lawson bart. are chief landowners. Mr. J. H. Proctor is greave of the manor: courts leet are held in April and October. The area of the civil parish and Urban District is 6,423 acres of land and 76 of water; rateable value, £71,784; the population in 1921 was 15,381.

The population of the Urban District wards in 1921 was:—Central, 4,321; East, 3,650; North, 2,814; West, 4,696.

The population of St. Andrew ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 1,047, and of St. Paul in 1901, 3,382.

TOTTINGTON HIGHER END, formerly a township in Bury civil parish, was, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1894, divided between the parishes of Ramsbottom, Haslingden and Rawtenstall.

OUT RAWCLIFFE is a township and parish, formed in 1848 from the civil parish of St. Michael-on-Wyre; it is on the north bank of the river Wyre, which forms the southern boundary of the parish, 4½ miles north-east from Poulton-le-Fyld; station on the Preston and Wyre section of the London, Midland and Scottish railway and 6 west-south-west from Garstang, in the Lancaster division of the county, hundred of Amounderness, county court district of Preston, petty sessional division, union and rural deanery of Garstang, archdeaconry of Lancaster and diocese of Manchester. The church of St. John, built in 1838 on land given by T. B. W. Ffrance esq. is a small edifice of brick in the Norman style, consisting of chancel, nave and aisles; it has four small turrets, one at each angle, the south-western turret containing one bell: there are 250 sittings, of which 175 are free. The register dates from the year 1838. The living is a
