RADCLIFFE AND PRESTWICH,

WITH PILKINGTON, STAND, UNSWORTH, WHITEFIELD, &c.

RADCLIFFE, a village and parish having no dependent township, is situated in the hundred of Salford, and diocese of Manchester, from which town it is distant six miles N.N.W. by road and seven by railway; and two miles and a half by rail S.S.W. from Bury. The area of the parish is 2,880 acres of land; and its population in 1801 was 2,497; in 1831, 3,904; in 1841, 5,099; and according to the parliamentary census of 1851, it contained 6,293 inhabitants. The rateable value of the parish in the present year, 1852, is £22,640. Radcliffe enjoys its full share of all those advantages which characterise the neighbouring towns, resulting from the establishment of the cotton and other manufactures, which consist chiefly of gingham, checks, ticks, nankeens, and fustians; besides cotton spinning, smallware manufactures, and calico printing: and in the parish and its neighbourhood are several coal mines—the whole affording employment to large numbers of the working population, both male and female. The East Lancashire Railway and the Bolton and Bury Canal, which pass close to the village, furnish the greatest facilities for the transit of its manufactures and merchandise to and from Manchester, Liverpool, Bury, and the principal towns and villages in the manufacturing district. The village is lighted with gas from the works of the Radcliffe and Pilkington Gas Company, formed in the year 1845.

The PARISH CHURCH of Radcliffe is a very ancient structure. The living is a rectory, rated in the King's Book at £21. 0s. 5d. and now valued at £368. It is in the patronage of the Earl of Wilton, and incumbency of the Rev. Nathaniel Milne. The aggregate amount of the tithes, commuted in 1839, is £99. 0s. 9d. ST. THOMAS', Chapel of Ease, is a neat building erected in 1821. The living is a perpetual curacy in the gift of the rector, and in the enjoyment of the Rev. Robert Fletcher; income, £120. The Wesleyan Methodists have two Chapels here, one at Radcliffe Bridge and the other at Radcliffe Hall. The latter is an excellent building of stone, in connexion with which is a Day and Sunday School, a neat brick building erected by subscription in 1851-2, at the cost of about £500. The LYCEUM, instituted in 1851, occupies a large room in Church-street, Mr. Samuel Wheelhouse, hon. secretary.

A new MARKET HOUSE was built in the village in 1851, at a cost of £1,500, by the Earl of Wilton, who is lord of the manor. The Poor House here, in connection with the Bury, occupies a healthy situation; the site, together with the materials necessary for its construction, were given by the late Earl of Wilton. Radcliffe Races are held annually, about the month of which the

August; and fairs on the 29th and 30th of April for horses and horned cattle; and on the 28th and 29th of September for wool, cloth, and pedlery.

PRESTWICH, a village and township in the parish of Prestwich-cum-Oldham, is four miles N.W. from Manchester, and five miles S.S.E. from Bury. The population of the township in 1801 was 1,811; in 1811, 2,175; in 1821, 2,724; in 1831, 2,941; in 1841, 3,180; and in 1851 it amounted to 4,070 persons. The gross value of Prestwich in 1850 was £15,115. 9s. 10d. and the rateable value £12,530. The area of the township is about 750 statute acres. The manorial rights belong to the Earl of Wilton. Though this is one of the most extensive parishes in Lancashire, yet no mention is made in the Domesday survey of any church existing here at that period,—but two centuries afterwards it is proved to have a parish church; and in the papal return made at that time, Oldham is not mentioned. This circumstance, therefore, seems decisive of the proper designation of the parish—awarding the precedency to Prestwich, and showing that when in connexion the name should be written Prestwich-cum-Oldham, as it stands in the parliamentary population return of 1841, and not Oldham-cum-Prestwich as it stood in that by which it was preceded. Mr. Whitaker, the historian of Manchester, speaks of a church being at Prestwich in Saxon times, but there is no conclusive evidence that such was the fact. The present Church, dedicated to St. Mary, is a stately Gothic structure, with a tower which is 85 feet in height, containing a peal of six bells. The date of its erection is fixed by several antiquarians about the year 1420. The Church may be said to overhang a rich and lovely valley, luxuriantly wooded, and presenting some rich and highly picturesque scenery, dotted with pleasant villages and populous towns,—while Manchester, more distant, is seen in a line of murky dignity, towering over all. The interior of the church, chiefly formed of solid oak, is in an excellent state of preservation. In the Wilton Chapel, which stands to the right of the altar, are several handsome monuments commemorative of various members of the noble house of Wilton. The living is a rectory, in the gift of the Marquis of Westminster, and incumbency of the Rev. Henry Mildred Birch, M.A.

ST. MARGARET'S CHURCH, Hodge lane, is a neat stone edifice, the first stone of which was laid on the 3rd of March, 1849, by the Duchess of Cambridge. It cost £2,500, raised by subscription. It is in the pointed Gothic style of architecture, opened in 1851, and consecrated in the early part of the present year (1852), by the Bishop of Manchester.

The COUNTY LUNATIC ASYLUM is a spacious range of buildings of brick, with stone facings, erected in 1851. The number of inmates is limited to 500. In connexion with this well arranged institution is a neat Chapel for the use of the inmates. Adjacent to the village, and fronting the Bury New road, is a Jewish Cemetery, a very peculiar building, erected in 1841. The house attached to it is occupied by Simon Henry Lazarus.

Manufactures spreading from Manchester have made considerable progress here, though much less than in that part of the parish which comes within the division of Oldham. The weaving of cotton and silk, checks, ginghams, and smallwares, chiefly for the Manchester houses, occupy many of the inhabitants of this and the neighbouring townships. The parish of Prestwich is about fifteen miles in length and four in breadth; a great part of the land is in pasture, and to the produce of the dairies Manchester is beholden for a large proportion of its daily supplies. The air of Prestwich and its immediate vicinity is remarkably pure, and the township is noted for the longevity of many of its inhabitants. In the year 1747, the ages of seven persons amounted in the aggregate to 558 years, namely—Dr. Goodwin, the rector, 70; Mr. Scholes, the curate, 78; Ralph Guest, churchwarden, 85; Robert Diggle, parish clerk, 85; Ann Diggle, his wife, 78; Edmund Berry, sexton, 76; and Mary Berry, his wife, 86. In 1821, according to the census then taken, there were found in the parish no fewer than forty-five persons between the ages of 80 and 90, and two between the ages of 90 and 100 years.

The townships of Great and Little Heaton are both in this parish, and adjacent to the village of Prestwich. They are respectively four and five miles north of Manchester. Great Heaton, situated on the southern extremity of Heaton Park, contains 838 acres, of the gross annual value of £2,671. 9s., rateable value £2,123. 11s. 3d., and the population in 1851 was 150. There are seventeen ratepayers in the township, fourteen of whom are farmers. Messrs. Joseph Kershaw and Sons have bleach works here, and here also are the dyeworks occupied by Messrs. James Royle and Sons. HEATON HOUSE, a seat of the Earl of Wilton, is a handsome modern structure of stone, erected by Whyatt, with columns of the Ionic order, and a circular projection in the centre, surmounted by a spacious dome. This fine mansion, of considerable dimensions, is situated on the Bury road, not far from the village of Prestwich, and in a verdant and well wooded park five miles in circumference. There are four entrances, and four lodges occupied by gatekeepers, but the principal entrance is from the Bury road by an elegant Doric lodge. ^{Wagon and} ^{ratt, San} a bold eminence in the park, at some distance from the house, stands a circular temple, ^{Wagon and} ^{ratt, San} commanding extensive and picturesque views of the four adjoining counties of Chester, Derby, and York. Some few years since, this charming spot was the scene of great festivity, ^{Wagon and} ^{ratt, San} on the races which were annually held on a fine course in the park. A lively interest

was attached to these meetings, which were numerous attended—the riders being for the most part the aristocratic guests of the noble earl. Heaton House, and gardens attached, cover an area of 90a. 3r. 21p. The township of Great Heaton contains neither church, chapel, public-house, beerhouse, nor provision shop.

LITTLE HEATON township, situated north of Heaton Park, contains 707 inhabitants according to the census of 1851; and the number of statute acres in the township is 500, of the annual value of £1,680, rateable value £1,369. 7s. 9½d. The **OLD HALL**, which has been twice rebuilt during the last and present century, is said to have been formerly occupied by the owners of the Heaton estates. Mr. Henry Royle is the present occupier of the Hall and land attached, containing about 90 acres, which is the largest farm in the township. Simister lane School, erected by the Countess of Wilton in 1852, at a cost of £300, and in which 120 scholars are instructed in reading, writing, grammar, and accounts, is situated in this township. This school, the benefits of which are highly appreciated by the inhabitants of the village, who are chiefly hand-loom silk weavers, is also supported by Lord Grey, eldest son of the Earl of Wilton, and other members of the family, who pay for the education of several children; and the curates of Prestwich Church, the Revds. Messrs. Wakefield and Booker, pay for the education of about thirty scholars. The school, which is under the superintendence of Mr. Thomas Wroe, has also been opened as a Sunday School in connexion with St. Margaret's Church, Prestwich, which is about a mile distant.

BOWLEE, a village containing nineteen houses and 93 inhabitants, is situated about two miles from Heywood, between Little Heaton and Middleton. The houses were built about forty years ago, and neither the owners nor the occupiers pay poor rates. They have never paid any rates, it not being determined in which township their hamlet is situated.

PILKINGTON is a township in the parish of Prestwich-cum-Oldham, containing the districts called Stand and Outwood, and the hamlets of Ringley, Unsworth, and Whitefield. These are localities in which manufactures are flourishing, and which maintain collectively a large population. Pilkington lies between six and seven miles N.W. from Manchester, and contained 12,861 inhabitants in 1851; the number of persons in the township in 1841 was 11,186. The number of statute acres in the township is 5,475a. 2r. 12p.; the gross valuation for 1851 was £36,406. 10s. 9d., and the rateable value £33,940. 15s. 6d. Bishop James Pilkington, B.D. who was the first Protestant prelate of the see of Durham, was the third son of Richard Pilkington, of Rivington Hall; he was born in the year 1518, and died at Aukland on the 23rd of Jan. 1575, in the 55th year of his age. The names and families of Rivington and Pilkington are so mixed up in their genealogy and pedigrees, that we may here, without trespass, introduce a notice of the remarkable eminence called "Rivington Pike." In the reign of Queen Elizabeth, when England was threatened with invasion by the "Invincible Armada" of Spain, the beacon upon Rivington Pike, standing at an elevation of 1,543 feet from the level of the sea, was kept for several months in a state of readiness, to apprise the inhabitants of the approach of the invaders (!) During the Napoleon dynasty, on the alarm of invasion by the French, the beacon was replaced,—but in the nineteenth as in the sixteenth century, it has never yet been required to spread alarm within the breasts of England's matrons, or its illumination over a peaceful country.

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH, commonly called Stand Church, is situated at Whitefield. The site was given by the late Earl of Derby, and the first stone was laid by the Earl of Wilton on the 3rd of August, 1822. The building, which was consecrated by Dr. Bloomfield, Bishop of Chester, on September 8th, 1826, is a handsome structure in the Gothic style of the fourteenth century, having a lofty tower 186 feet in height, enriched with turrets and pinnacles. The interior consists of side aisles, with spacious galleries round three of its sides, and a nave, at the west end of which is an open arcade, with fine arched entrances. It will afford sitting accommodation to 1,836 worshippers, of whom nearly 1,000 have free sittings. The cost of the building was £14,987. 4s., exclusive of £400, the cost of new east windows of stained glass, well executed by Mr. D. Evans, of Shrewsbury, in 1843, and representing Saints Peter, James, and John. Mrs. E. Ramsbotham, of Wallfield, Pilkington, was sole contributor to these beautiful windows. The living, which was raised to the dignity of a rectory in 1848, is enjoyed by the Rev. Thomas Corser, M.A.

ST. GEORGE'S CHURCH, Unsworth, was rebuilt in 1843, on the site of one erected in 1729. It is a beautiful Gothic structure, to which a handsome parsonage is attached. The exterior of the church has a light and elegant appearance, and the altar is a beautiful piece of workmanship. The sum of £2,000 was expended in the re-erection of the church. These funds were raised by subscription, aided by a grant of £300 from the Church Building Society; and the parsonage house and gardens, near the church, were erected and enclosed in 1848, at an expenditure of upwards of £1,200. The Rev. Benjamin Crompton is the incumbent of the curacy. **ST. SAVIOUR'S CHURCH**, Ringley, erected in 1851, is a neat edifice of stone, of which the Rev. James R. Lyon, M.A. is incumbent.

There is a Congregational Chapel at Scarr Brow, of which the Rev. John Hopkins is the minister. The Independents have a neat place of worship at Chapelfield, under the pastoral care of the Rev. Alexander Anderson, B.A. The Wesleyan Methodist Chapel at Unsworth is a handsome edifice in the Roman Ionic style, built in 1846, at a cost of £3,000. The Unitarian Chapel at Stand, and the New Jerusalem Chapel situated in Stand lane, are both commodious edifices.

Sunday Schools are attached to all the places of worship, and in addition to which there are several excellent Day Schools, both public and private, in different parts of the township. These beneficial institutions are liberally supported and highly appreciated by all classes. The most important educational institution, perhaps, in the township, is the British School and Mechanics' Institution, situated in Park lane. It was erected in 1847; at the sole expense of Robert Needham Philips, Esq., at a cost of £1,000, and was opened in January, 1848. The building is a very handsome structure of brick, in the modern Gothic style of architecture. The average daily number of pupils in attendance is 212. The subjects taught are reading, writing, arithmetic, English grammar, history, composition, natural philosophy, vocal and instrumental music, and drawing. The school is under government inspection, and presided over by Mr. Edward Gregory. The Mechanics' Institution, established in connection with the school, consists of a library of 300 volumes, a news room, and evening classes; and the inhabitants are mainly indebted for the formation and support of this useful institution to R. N. Philips, Esq. the president.

Post Office, Blackburn street, RADCLIFFE, John Heaton, *Post Master*.—Letters from all parts arrive (from Manchester), every morning at quarter-past seven, and half-past three in the afternoon, and are despatched thereto at twenty minutes past twelve and half-past seven in the afternoon.

Post Office, PRESTWICH, Thomas Blinkhorn, *Post Master*.—Letters from all parts arrive every morning at twenty minutes past seven and thirty minutes past one, and quarter to five in the evening, and are despatched at half-past ten in the morning, and half-past two and twenty minutes past seven in the evening.

Post Office, UNSWORTH, Robert Wroe, *Post Master*.—Letters from all parts arrive (from Bury) every morning (Sundays excepted) at nine, and are despatched at three in the afternoon.

Post Office, Besses-o'th'-Barn, WHITEFIELD, John Mills, *Post Master*.—Letters from all parts arrive (from Radcliffe) every forenoon (Sundays excepted) at eleven, and are despatched at twenty minutes past five in the afternoon.

MIDDLETON,

WITH THE VILLAGE OF BIRCH, THE TOWNSHIPS OF TONGE, HOPWOOD, AND THORNHAM.

MIDDLETON is an ancient market town and parish in the hundred of Salford, and diocese of Manchester, supposed to have derived its name from the situation which it occupies—being the centre of several neighbouring towns. It is distant 4 miles w. from Oldham, 5 miles s. from Rochdale, and 6 miles n. from Manchester. Its population in 1831 was 14,379; in 1841, it was 15,488; and in 1851 it contained about 18,000, of which last number 8,717 were returned for the township; to which may be added 3,831 in the township of Tonge, which, though situated in the parish of Prestwich-cum-Oldham, is suburban to Middleton, and so intimately connected with that town, both in trade and proximity, as to be scarcely distinguishable from it;—therefore the population of the town of Middleton, according to the late census, would amount to 12,548 persons. In the time of the Commonwealth the population of the parish was estimated at 500. The territorial extent of the parish of Middleton comprises 11,510 English statute acres, of which number 1,860 acres belongs to the township.

Middleton claims a high antiquity, and ranks as one of the most ancient parishes in the county. It was possessed at a very early period by the Bartons; and in the fifteenth century the lordship passed by marriage with Margery, niece and heiress of Richard Barton to Sir Ralph de Assheton, of Ashton-under-Lyne, in which family it continued for many generations. This Sir Ralph, who was knight marshal of England in the reign of Edward IV., was the notorious "Black Knight" of Ashton-under-Lyne, whose execrable tyrannies are still commemorated in that town by the ceremony of "The Riding of the Black Lad" (see page 685).
