- 🤝 intervene early to support people susceptible to radicalisation.
- 🔗 enable those who have already engaged in terrorism to disengage and support behaviour change.

Together, through awareness and early action, we can protect vulnerable people and strengthen our communities against all forms of radicalisation.

New: GM Level 2 Prevent and Channel Workshop

Bury is proud to announce we have adopted a Manchester-designed and GM adopted Level 2 Prevent and Channel workshop to complement the Home Office Level 3 Advanced Prevent training.

While the Home Office Level 3 Advanced provides the statutory framework, national policy context and core Prevent requirements, the Manchester Level 2 workshop adds a practical, locally focused layer.


The session is interactive and case-study based, helping practitioners to:

- ⌚ Apply Prevent and Channel principles to real-world scenarios
- ⌚ Understand Greater Manchester and local risk profiles
- ⌚ Build confidence using the **Notice, Check, Share** approach
- ⌚ Explore local referral pathways and multi-agency decision-making
- ⌚ Strengthen professional judgement when managing complex safeguarding concerns

Together, these level 2 & Level 3 courses ensure frontline staff and safeguarding leads have both the national understanding and the local, practical confidence needed to respond effectively to concerns about radicalisation.

National Picture

Threat level

The threat to the UK from terrorism is currently substantial. This indicates that an attack is likely. It is the middle of the 5 levels of threat which terrorism is assessed against, with the level set by the Joint Terrorism Analysis Centre and the Security Service.

What is terrorism?

Terrorism is defined in **Section 1 Terrorism**

Act 2000 as the use or threat of action

designed to:

- influence the government or an international governmental organisation; or
- intimidate the public, or a section of the public.
- made for the purposes of advancing a political, religious, racial or ideological cause; and it involves or causes:
- serious violence against a person.
- serious damage to a property.
- a threat to a person's life.
- a serious risk to the health and safety of the public; or
- serious interference with or disruption to an electronic system.
