Did you Know!

On Monday 20 October, the Government laid an Order before Parliament amending Schedule 2 to the Terrorism Act 2000 (TACT) by removing Hay'at Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) from the list of proscribed terrorist organisations

We expect the Order to come into force during w/c 10 November.

This decision follows assessments indicating that HTS is no longer aligned with Al-Qa'ida and that Syria's current government actively rejects terrorism.

The move aims to support Syria's stability and reduce risks to the UK from global terrorism and illegal migration

National Picture

Threat level

The threat to the UK from terrorism is currently substantial. This indicates that an attack is likely. It is the middle of the 5 levels of threat which terrorism is assessed against, with the level set by the Joint Terrorism Analysis Centre and the Security Service.

What is terrorism?

Terrorism is defined in <u>Section 1</u>

<u>Terrorism Act 2000</u> as the use or threat of action designed to:

- influence the government or an international governmental organisation; or
- intimidate the public, or a section of the public.
- made for the purposes of advancing a political, religious, racial or ideological cause; and it involves or causes:
- serious violence against a person.
- serious damage to a property.
- a threat to a person's life.
- a serious risk to the health and safety of the public; or
- serious interference with or disruption to an electronic system.
