PUBLISHERS' NOTE.

Many inquiries have been made from time to time as to the existence of a work of the nature of the present publication for Bury; and much encouragement has been given during its compilation by the hearty manner in which the idea has been received, not only by the tradespeople of the town, but by professional men and officials in various capacities, to whom for their kind assistance in rendering information we beg to express our best thanks.

Every endeavour has been made to give information so clearly and fully that an entire stranger to Bury may by a short study gain a general knowledge of the town which would otherwise require endless inquiries and much labour.

The outline Map shows only the general plan of the main streets, roads, and places in the town, and does not indicate the whole extent of its boundary on any side.

BURY.—Historical Notes, &c.

Bury is a parliamentary and county borough in the County Palatine of Lancaster. It is nine miles north of Manchester by rail, 35 east of Liverpool, and 195 north-west of London. The town is built on the banks of the river Irwell, and has a mean elevation of about 300 feet above the sea level, the lowest point, at Blackford Bridge, being 223 feet high, and the highest, at Higher Sedger Hey, 765 feet. The maximum air temperature in the year 1898, was 75deg. Fahr., and the minimum 29deg. Fahr., the observations being recorded at 9 a.m. on August 14th and November 29th respectively, in the Manchester-road Recreation Ground. The rainfall registered in the same year was 40.12 inches, and rain fell on 164 days. The rainfall was more than twice that registered at Greenwich in the same year.

Though Bury has few really ancient landmarks, it undoubtedly existed as a township and ecclesiastical parish in very early times. The name, like the German *burg*, signifies a stronghold, and apart from any topographical survivals is evidence of Saxon occupation. The question whether or not the town can claim a still earlier origin is hardly likely to be satisfactorily solved, and the most pronounced opinion that antiquaries will hazard upon the subject is that, bearing in mind the proximity of the road from Manchester to Ribchester, there is nothing inherently improbable in the idea that it was a Roman station. The ancient parish is very extensive, having an area of 27,244 statute acres, its greatest length from north to south being ten miles, and its greatest breadth from east to west five miles. It comprises the townships of Bury, Cowpe-Lench, Elton, Heap, Musbury, Tottington Higher End, Tottington Lower End, and Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth. It is said that a church has existed on the site of the present Parish Church since the latter part of the eleventh century. A new church was built between the years 1285 and 1290, and a restoration of this fabric was carried out in 1535. The registers date from the year 1590. The church was again re-built between the years 1773 and 1780, the old tower remaining untouched. Having been damaged in 1839, the tower was, however, removed in 1843, the present tower and spire being built in the two years following. The church of 1780 was demolished in 1870, and between the years 1872 and 1876 the present church was built, being consecrated on February 2nd, 1876. The churchyard, which had been enlarged in 1843, was closed for interments in 1855. In all, the ancient parish contains 24 churches. In the town itself there are, including the Parish Church, nine—St. John's, consecrated June 8th, 1770; St. Paul's, June 29th, 1842; All Saints', Elton, June 29th, 1843;

Holy Trinity, April 19th, 1865; St. Thomas's, December 10th, 1866; St. Peter's, June 29th, 1872 (at present undergoing reconstruction); St. Stephen's, Elton, May 22nd, 1882; and St. Mark's, October 1st, 1883. The Protestant Nonconformists have a large number of chapels. The oldest is the Bank-street Unitarian Presbyterian Chapel, which was established in Silver-street in 1719, and was last re-built in 1852. The Unitarians have also a school-chapel at Chesham, opened in 1883. Congregationalism is represented by four churches—New Road, founded in 1790, and re-built in 1885 (opened October 21st); Bethel, Henry-street, opened November 19th, 1807; Castlecroft, September 9th, 1840; and Blackford Bridge, 1875, new chapel March 19th, 1889. The Wesleyan Methodists have five chapels in the town—Union-street (founded in Clerke-street in 1785), opened January 7th, 1817; Pits-o'th'-Moor (founded in 1760) school-chapel, 1774, new chapel opened September, 1896; Woolfold, May 10th, 1848; Elton, April 13th, 1882; and Russell-street, 1884. In the Bury Wesleyan Circuit are also included churches at Birtle, Walshaw, Tottington, Summerseat, and Hawkshaw. The Methodists of the New Connexion have been established in Bury since 1797; they built a chapel in Bolton-street in 1813, and their present chapel in Heywood-street was opened on February 1.4th, 1879. Primitive Methodism obtained a footing in the town early in the twenties; the chapel in William-street was built in 1829, and the Walmersley-road Chapel, which superseded it, was opened on February 15th, 1866. The United Methodist Free Church has existed in Bury since 1835. The first Brunswick Chapel was opened March 24th, 1837, and the new building December 7th, 1864. Other chapels belonging to the denomination are at Heap Bridge, Elton, Warth, Birtle, Parkhills, and Limefield. The New Jerusalem Church (Swedenborgian) was opened December 13th, 1860. The Particular Baptists have a chapel, founded in 1836, at Freetown. A Baptist chapel was opened in Knowsley-street in 1853, the congregation removing to a new chapel in Tenterden-street on October 22nd, 1898. There is also a new Baptist Chapel at Chesham, and at the Christian Church, Rochdale-road, opened September 13th, 1860, the teachings of the Baptist denomination are also encouraged. The Welsh Presbyterians have a chapel, founded in 1882, in Benson-street, with services every Sunday in their own language. Bury is the head of a Roman Catholic rural deanery. The oldest church is that of St. Marie, Manchester Road, opened August 10th, 1842. St. Joseph's Church, Peter-street, dates from 1873; and the Guardian Angels Church, Elton, from 1886.

The oldest educational institution in Bury is the Grammar School, which was originally founded by the Rev. Henry Bury in 1625. Afterwards it fell more or less into desuetude. It was re-founded by the Rev. Roger Kay, Prebendary of Salisbury and

a native of Bury, on May 6th, 1726. Since then the foundation has been augmented by several valuable scholarships. At the present time there is in existence a scheme for the amalgamation of the Grammar School foundation with the money coming to Bury from the Hulme Trust funds. Under this scheme Bury receives a capital sum of £18,000 (with leave to borrow a further sum of £10,000), and an income the minimum of which is fixed at £1,250 and the maximum at £2,050 per annum. It is proposed to erect a new Grammar School for boys and girls with the money received. There are several High Schools for Girls and Boys in the town. The educational authority under the Elementary Schools Acts is the School Attendance Committee of the Town Council. The schools are Voluntary, and consist of British and Denominational Schools. Of these the oldest is the Bury National School, founded as a Free School in the eighteenth century, and now known as the Parish Church Schools. The Free School stood for several generations at the junction of Stanley-street with Clough-street, the present buildings, off Lower Bank-street, being erected in 1887. There is also a Municipal Technical School, built at a cost of £22,102, and opened September 15th, 1894.

Prior to 1832 Bury was a part of the Parliamentary Division of South Lancashire. In that year it became a Parliamentary Borough. Its first Member of Parliament was Mr. Richard Walker. He was re-elected in 1835, 1837, 1841, and 1847, and in all represented the borough for nearly twenty years. His successor was Mr. Frederick Peel, a son of Sir Robert Peel, the Prime Minister, who was elected in 1852. Mr. Peel was defeated by Mr. R. N. Philips in 1857, but two years later, when Mr. Philips was not nominated, he was again elected. In 1865 Mr. Philips again defeated Mr. Peel, and continued to represent the borough down to the year 1865, being re-elected in 1868, 1874, and 1880. In 1885 Mr. Philips retired from the representation, and Sir Henry James was returned as a Liberal. In 1886 and 1892 Sir Henry James was returned as a Liberal Unionist. The present Member, Mr. James Kenyon, was elected in 1895 as a Conservative. Mr. Walker and Mr. Philips described themselves as Liberals, and Mr. Peel was elected as a Liberal-Conservative. The number of voters now on the register is 8,515.

John Warburton, 1681-1759; Fellow of the Royal and Antiquarian Societies; Somerset Herald. Samuel Kay, M.D., 1708-1784; one of the first physicians of the Manchester Royal Infirmary. John Kay (Park, Walmersley), 1704 (date and place of death unknown); inventor of the fly-shuttle, &c. Robert Kay (son of the last-named), 1726-1802; inventor of the drop-box. Dr. James Wood (Holcombe), 1761-1839; Master of St. John's College, Cambridge; Dean of Ely. Richard Walker, 1784-1855; first Member of Parliament for Bury. The brothers Sir Robert Peel (second baronet), 1788-1850, Prime Minister; Right Hon. William Yates Peel, 1789-1858; General Jonathan Peel, 1799-1879. Sir William Hardman, 1828-1890; Recorder of Kingston-on-Thames, Chairman of Surrey Sessions, editor of the "Morning Post," first Chairman of the Grand Council of the Primrose League. Oliver Ormerod Walker, 1833—; M.P. for Salford 1877-1880; High Sheriff of Lancashire 1876. Sir George Frederic Verdon (Tottington), 1834-1896; member of the Legislative Assembly of Victoria (Australia) and Finance Minister. Rev. John Russell Walker, 1837-1887; Archdeacon of Chichester. James Kenyon, 1846—; elected M.P. for Bury in 1895.

The first Bury Improvement Act, vesting the government of the town in a Board of Commissioners, was passed in 1846. The town received its charter of incorporation on September 9th, 1876, and it became a county borough under the provisions of the Local Government Act of 1888. The boundaries were extended by the Bury Improvement Act of 1885 and the Redistribution of Seats Act of the same year. Under the régime of the Corporation the appearance of the town has greatly improved. The streets have been widened, and are better paved and lighted, a great deal of insanitary property has been swept away, and several fine public buildings have been erected or are in course of erection. These include the Technical School and the Public Library and Art Gallery. Among the municipal undertakings contemplated in the near future are a new Market, Public Abattoirs, and an Infectious Diseases Hospital. The Town Clerk's and Borough Surveyor's offices, and the Council

Chamber, are situated in Bank-street; and the Borough Treasurer's and Rate Collector's offices in Parsons-lane. The Town Council is composed of a Mayor, eight Aldermen, and thirty-two Councillors. For voting purposes the town is divided into five wards—Moorside, Redvales, East, Church, and Elton.

Few towns of its size have benefited more than Bury from the munificence of its sons and citizens. Apart from the gifts to its educational institutions, there is the Dispensary-Hospital, which was founded by private munificence and is maintained by voluntary subscriptions. There are also the Recreation Grounds, which comprise in all upwards of 50 acres of land, and which have been given by private individuals or have been obtained by money raised by the voluntary subscriptions of many. The Elton Recreation Ground, opened May 29th, 1886, was given by Mr. Henry Whitehead, of Haslem Hey; the greater part of the Rochdale Road Recreation Ground, with the cost of laying out the same, by Mr. Thomas Ormerod Openshaw; the cost of the Walmersley Road and the Manchester Road Recreation Grounds was defrayed largely by public subscriptions (assisted in the former case by a sum of £7,550 handed over by the Duchy of Lancaster out of the Schofield estate); and the cost of the Blackford Bridge Recreation Ground was met by Mr. John Barlow, of Wellfield. The Elton Recreation Ground was opened by Mrs. H. Whitehead. The Walmersley-road and Rochdale-road Recreation Grounds were opened by H.R.H. the late Duke of Clarence on July 21st, 1888; and the Manchester Road Ground by the late Earl of Derby on August 30th, 1890. The Blackford Bridge Ground was opened by Mrs. Westerdale, sister of the donor, on July 29th, 1899. Other valuable gifts have been the Wrigley collection of pictures and art treasures, the value of which is probably £100,000; donations to the Public Library and Art Gallery; and the handsome fountain at Buckley Wells.

Among other concerns which are the property of the Corporation are the Waterworks, Gasworks, Public Baths, Electric Light Works, and Markets. The most valuable property is that at present governed by the Waterworks Committee, to a share of which the other authorities in the supply area will shortly be admitted. At present the Waterworks, which may be roughly valued at £1,000,000, consist of eight reservoirs, with an aggregate storage capacity of 847,575,000 gallons. The reservoirs are situated at Cloughbottom, Hapton, Calf Hey, Holden Wood, Harden Clough, Cross Bank, Gin Hall, and Clarke's Hill. The Waterworks, inaugurated by a private company in 1836, became the property of the ratepayers in 1872. The Gasworks were established as a private company in 1828, and became the property of the ratepayers on January 1st, 1858. The Baths were opened in May, 1864. Additional swimming bath accommodation was added in 1894, and the Turkish bath was

reconstructed in 1898. The Markets were erected by the Earl of Derby in 1839, being opened on March 24th of that year, and were purchased by the Bury Improvement Commissioners in 1872, at a cost, including land and manorial rights, of £51,296. The General Market contains 48 shops and 148 stalls. There is also a Fish Market with ten stalls. The Electric Lighting Works were opened on November 5th, 1896, the capital expenditure to March 31st, 1899, being £33,079.

The Bury Public Cemetery was opened May 21st, 1869. It has an area of 33 acres, 1 pole, 27 perches, of which 20 acres are laid out in grave spaces and the rest in shrubberies and flower beds. Interments are still made in St. Paul's and All Saints' Churchyards. There is also a cemetery belonging to the Unitarians at Holebottom, Birtle.

At the present time the Bury tramways are a branch of the Bury, Rochdale, and Oldham Tramway Company's system, and are worked by steam. Under a recently acquired Act of Parliament, however, the Corporation have the power to purchase or construct tramlines, and to work the same by horse, steam, or electric power.

The industries of Bury are of a varied character, and comprise cotton, woollen, and paper manufacturing, bleaching, dyeing, and calico printing, and engineering of several descriptions, but particularly the making of textile and paper-making machinery. Bury blankets are known all over the world. Although hardly entitled to rank as one of the industries of the town, the making of simnels and black puddings has contributed in some degree to the spreading of the fame of Bury.

Horse, Cattle, and Pleasure Fairs are held on March 5th, May 3rd, and September 18th each year. When these dates fall on a Sunday the fairs are held on the day following. A cattle fair is also held on the second and fourth Monday in each month. Saturday is the market day. Bury Wakes commence on the fourth Saturday in August.

The town possesses two railway stations on the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, one on the main line from Liverpool to Yorkshire and the other on the East Lancashire section. The East Lancashire Railway Company was started in 1846, chiefly by the enterprise of Bury men, for the purpose of bringing the East Lancashire district into communication with the great railway systems of England. It had for many years a successful career, and was at length, in 1859, amalgamated on equal and honourable terms with the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company.

The Bury Poor-Law Union contains the townships and parishes of Bury, Heywood, Radcliffe, Ramsbottom, Whitefield, Ainsworth, Birtle-cum-Bamford, Outwood, Unsworth, Tooting: 1,

and *Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth*. There are 31 Guardians, Bury having ten; *Heywood*, *Radcliffe*, and *Ramsbottom* four each; *Unsworth* and *Birtle-cum-Barnford* two each; and *Whitefield*, *Ainsworth*, *Outwood*, *Tottington*, and *Walmersley-cum-Shuttleworth* one each. The Union Workhouse, which is at *Jericho*, was built in 1858. The Union Offices are situated in *Parsons Lane*. The population of the Union in 1891 was 141,969, the assessable value being £599,988. The boundaries of the County Court district are co-terminous with those of the Union.

The Bury Barracks, which were opened on April 29th, 1845, are the depôt of the Twentieth Regimental District. The Volunteer Drill Hall, the headquarters of the 1st V.B.L.F., is built upon a portion of the site of the ancient castle, and some of the stones from the foundations of the latter may be observed in the main entrance. The hall may be regarded as the largest assembly-room in the town, and is capable of seating about 5,000 persons. It was opened in 1863.

The Athenæum is a subscription club, opened November 23rd, 1853, for the promotion of literary and social intercourse. On the ground floor it has a lending library, reference library, news-room, smoke-room, and billiard-room; and on the upper storey a fine assembly-room. Among other institutions and associations of the town are a first-class Football Club, Cricket Club, Lawn Tennis Clubs, Golf Club, Cycling Clubs, Botanical Association, Photographic and Arts Club, Angling Association, Fanciers' Association, Political and Social Clubs, Bowling Clubs, Sunday School Unions, Young Men's Christian Association, Temperance Societies, Ambulance Corps, Trades Associations, &c., &c.

Though the centre of a densely-populated manufacturing district, Bury is not void of natural attractions. Within easy reach are such centres of rural beauty as *Holcombe Hill*, *Redisher Woods*, *Top-o'th'-Hough* (*Grant's Tower*), *Summerscat*, *Ashworth Valley*, *Simpson Clough*, *Birtle Dene*, *Ringley Woods*, and *Prestwich Clough*. These spots have escaped for the most part the exploitations which during the present reign have so altered the face of a great part of the County Palatine, and any one of them will afford the wearied town-dweller an afternoon of pleasant recreation or dreamy repose.

The borough has an area of 5,836 acres. According to the census of 1891 the population was 57,212. The estimated population for 1899 was 60,579. Notwithstanding the humidity of the atmosphere the death-rate is comparatively low, having been 17.82 per 1,000 in the year 1898. The ratable value for county purposes is £256,878.

Bury Parliamentary & Municipal Boundary.

As Extended by the Bury Improvement Act, 1885, and the
Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885, Schedule 5.

Superficial area, 5,835 statute acres.

Starting at the junction of the rivers Irwell and Roach, it runs along the centre of the river Roach, including detached portions of Bury, Pilkington, Pilsworth, Heap, and Birtle to Broad Oak Wood, thence along a brook through Smethurst Wood to Rochdale Old Road, and continuing in a line to the centre of the reservoir at Ned Mill, thence in a line by the road to Birtle Schools and Mawkin, returning along the boundary of the township of Bury near to Holebottom, thence to or near Hercules, Gorsey Brow, Birchen Bower, Bradshaw Hill, and Top-o'-th'-Hill (including a detached portion at Broadcarr), until the said boundary joins Walmersley, near the Dark Lane Colliery, thence within the said township, including Longcroft and Mount Pleasant, to as far as the junction of the roads at Oldfield, thence along the old road to Bass Lane and following the boundary of the Ramsbottom Local Board district to the point where the same joins the township of Elton, near Chestwheel Bridge, thence within Elton (outside the district of Ramsbottom Local Board) to Daubhole, then between Brandlesome Moss and Woodroad, to and across Brandlesome Road, near Longsight, thence along a fence and past the westerly side of Brandlesome Old Hall and keeping parallel to the Brandlesome Road, and curving round near to Hopkinson's Farm to footbridge over Kirklees Brook, thence in a straight line to and past the Lamb Inn for a distance of about 70 yards, thence in a straight line to the easterly end of Bolholt Works reservoir, thence through the centre of the said reservoir and along the brook dividing the Townships of Elton and Tottington to Four-Lane-Ends, thence along road to Height Barn, thence by an occupation road to road between Bentley Hall and Old Holts, thence along a fence in a south-westerly direction to the boundary dividing the Townships of Elton and Ainsworth and the boundary dividing the Townships of Elton and Radcliffe near Lowercroft Reservoir, thence along the boundary past Moor Nook to Starling, thence along the said boundary past Pilkington's to Bolton Road at Spring Fold, thence along a brook near Round Oak to the centre of the Canal Reservoir, and then northwards to the end of the Canal Feeder, thence to the River Irwell near Hinds, thence along the centre of the river excepting Warth Fold to Dumers Lane Bridge, thence in a straight line in a southerly direction again to the river, thence along the centre of the river and a portion of Bury on the westerly side of the river to the junction of the Rivers Irwell and Roach.

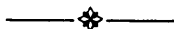
