FIRE BRIGADE.

Superintendent—Mr. Edward Geall, Fire Station, Stanley Street.

The Steam Fire Engine, Hose Carrier, and Fire Escape are kept at the Fire Station, Stanley Street; Fire Escape and Hose Carrier at the Fire Station, Victoria Street, Elton. In case of fire, information should be given at the Chief Fire Station, Stanley Street; the Fire Station, Victoria Street, Elton; or the Police Station in Market Street, as all are connected by Telephone. The Fire Brigade can also be called by breaking the glass of the street Fire-Alarms situated in the following places:—Manchester Road, near Gigg Lane; Rochdale Road, the top of Pimhole Lane; Limefield, the top of Pigslee Brow; Tottington Road, near Swan Hotel; Hardy's Gate; and Bridge Hall Lane. The Subscribers to the Telephone Exchange in Castle Chambers, Market Place, can also call the Brigade in case of fire.

THE PUBLIC BATHS.

Open in the Summer season at 6 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. Winter season, open at 8 a.m. and close at 7 p.m.. On Sunday: in Summer the Baths are open at 6 and close at 9 a.m.; in Winter open at 7 and close at 9 a.m. The ticket office is closed half-an-hour previous to the closing of the Baths. The whole of the Baths are set apart for females on Tuesday in each week. No ticket for Turkish baths issued in the Winter season after p.m., and on Sundays after 7 30 a.m. Summer season commences May 1st, and ends September 30th; Winter season commences October 1st, and ends April 30th.

THE MARKETS

are open daily (Sunday and Christmas Day excepted). Open Good Friday from 7 a.m. to 10 a.m. for the sale of fish. From March 29th to September 29th, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., Wednesday and Thursday; 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Mondays; 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Tuesdays; 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Fridays; and 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. on Saturdays. September 29th to March 29th, the Market open half-an-hour later each morning of the week, and closes at the times above stated. On Whit Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, closed at 9 o'clock; and Thursday before Whit Friday, Christmas Eve, and New Year's Eve, at 10 o'clock.

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

The Inspector's Office in the Market Hall, Bury, is open every Tuesday and Thursday, from 8 30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and every other week-day from 8 30 to 9 30 a.m.

THE CEMETERY.

The Cemetery is open to the public from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. from May 1st to August 31st; and from 7 a.m. to sunset from September 1st to April 30th. The Registrar's Office at the Cemetery is open daily (except Sundays) from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for the sale of graves, notice of interments, &c.

Twenty-four hours' notice, at least, to be given to the Registrar at the Cemetery, of intention to inter; but if the interment is intended to be on a Monday, the notice must be given not later than 12 o'clock the previous Saturday. When a Vault or Bricked Grave is to be made, three clear days' notice is to be given. A certificate from the Surgeon or Nurse is required before the interment of the still-born, and the Registrar's Certificate in all other cases.

The hours of interment are, on Week-days only:—

From April 1st to September 30th—Unconsecrated Ground, at 3 p.m.; Consecrated, at 4 p.m.; Roman Catholic, at 5 p.m.

From October 1st to March 31st—Unconsecrated Ground, at 2 p.m.; Consecrated, at 3 p.m.; Roman Catholic, at 4 p.m.

Interments out of or after the appointed hours, Extra Charges. This rule will be strictly enforced.
