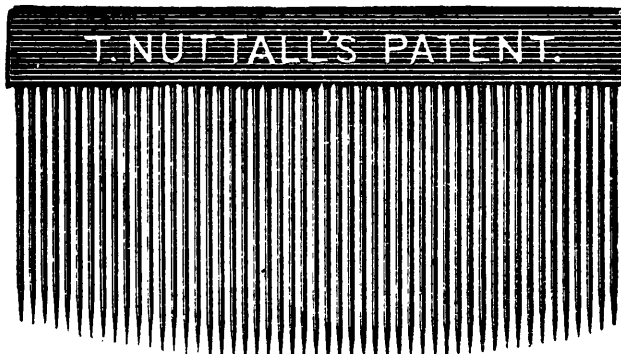

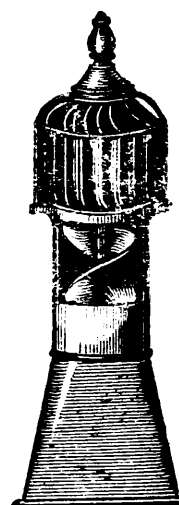
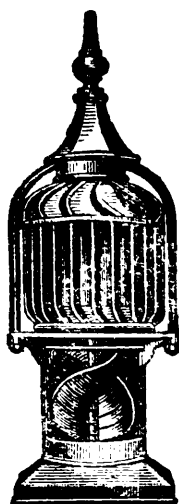

# HEYWOOD,

HEAP, HOPWOOD, AND HOOLEY BRIDGE.

**HEYWOOD** is a populous and flourishing corporate town, within the chapelry of Heap, parish of Bury, and hundred of Salford, about three miles E. from Bury, the same distance S.W. from Rochdale, and eight N. from Manchester (9½ by rail), situated on the banks of the Roach, and on the line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire railway. Heywood is principally situated in the township of Heap, but in 1864 the town adopted the Local Government Act, and now extends into the townships of Castleton, Hopwood, Pilsworth and Birtles, and has a ratable value of over £100,000. By an Act obtained in 1867 the Heywood Gas Company transferred their works to the Local Board. The town is well supplied with water, which is of excellent quality. Both works are now the property of the Corporation, the latter having been purchased in 1877 from the Heywood Waterworks Co. The town having made application for a charter of incorporation, the same was granted, and the first election of councillors for the newly created borough took place on the 12th April, 1881, and the first meeting of the council on the 20th of the same month, when Thomas Isherwood, Esq., was elected mayor. This town is the place from which the return is made at the election of members to represent the Heywood division of South-East Lancashire, created by the passing of the Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885, and at the general election in that year, and again in 1886, Isaac Hoyle, Esq., was returned as its representative. Heywood has for some years past been advancing in population and consequence as a place where manufactories have been firmly established; and it has now arrived at a rank of importance amongst the seats of the cotton trade. There are railway waggon works, also iron foundries, boiler works, and an establishment for the manufacture of power looms. Upwards of fifty cotton factories are in operation in the town and vicinity, employed in spinning the material and weaving fustians, calicoes, nankeens, ticks, and various cotton fabrics. A branch of the Rochdale canal comes up to the town, and the railway before mentioned passes through it, affording their respective facilities for the conveyance of persons and manufactures from this busy locality. The magistrates of the district hold a petty sessions every Wednesday, at the Court House. Heywood is included in the Bury circuit of towns under the County Court Acts.

So lately as 1834, although the population of the township was then over 10,000 souls, the only place of worship under the Establishment in the ancient chapelry of Heap was Heywood Chapel, now known as St. Luke's. The origin of this chapel is unknown, and has been a source of considerable speculation on the part of eminent ecclesiastical archaeologists. It is marked on Sexton's map of Lancashire, published in 1543, and Bishop Gaskell, in his "Notitia Cestriensis," asserts that it never was consecrated. The late Canon Raines, of Milnrow, believed that it was originally a chantry built by the Heywoods, of Heywood Hall, for the use of their tenantry, and there is no trace or evidence existing of any presentation to the living of Heywood by the rectors of Bury, as patrons, before the period of the Commonwealth, when Mr. Jonathan Schofield, Independent minister, was in possession. He was ejected from the living at the Restoration, but the rectors of Bury do not appear as patrons until the early years of the eighteenth century. In 1834 the Rev. Robert Minnitt was appointed to the living as perpetual curate, as five or six of his predecessors had been, by the rectors of Bury; and he immediately began to make vigorous efforts to provide more church accommodation for the rapidly increasing population.

Heywood was then sharing with the whole of Lancashire in the material prosperity resulting from the marvellous development of the cotton manufacture; and Mr. Minnitt succeeded in impressing the wealthy employers of labour with a sense of their responsibility, the final issue of which was the building and endowing of St. James's district church in 1836-7, and the erection of St. James's Sunday schools. In 1851 Mr. Minnitt resigned the perpetual curacy, to which the rector of Bury immediately presented the Rev. Julius Shadwell, and about the same time the rectorial tithes of the township of Heap were (with the consent of Lord Derby as patron of the rectory of Bury) annexed to the living, and thus the perpetual curacy of Heywood became a rectory. This is scarcely the place to detail the great improvement which Mr. Shadwell effected in Heywood. In 1860 Heywood chapel was taken down and the present large and handsome church built on the old site. The total cost of its erection, and subsequent decoration, including a large and powerful organ, the painting of the windows, carving, and the Bamford chapel, was over £21,000, of which £500 was contributed by the scholars of the schools belonging to the church, who in 1851 commenced a system of weekly contributions for the purpose; the remaining sum was raised by voluntary subscription from the gentry and manufacturers in the neighbourhood. The church is designed after the ecclesiastical architecture of the period of Edward III. It accommodates 1,150 persons, without galleries, and one half of the sittings are free. The tower, which is of the height of 188 feet, contains a good peal of eight bells. The living of Heywood is a rectory, in the diocese of Manchester, of the annual value of about £400. There are chapels for Baptists, and United Free Church, Wesleyan, and Primitive Methodists, a Roman Catholic chapel, and one each, for Unitarians and Swedenborgians. The Independents have also a chapel and schools, which were erected at a cost of £6,000. The chapel is in the Gothic style, with sitting accommodation for 750, and was opened in June, 1869. The oldest paper extant within the radius of five miles is the *Heywood Advertiser* (Friday), formerly published in the town, but now published in Rochdale. The National school, a handsome building (originally founded in 1815), was erected in 1860, at a cost of over £4,500; it is capable of accommodating 700 scholars, and is supported by subscriptions and school fees. There are also St. James's day, Sunday, and district schools, and others in connection with the Roman Catholic, Swedenborgian and Wesleyan congregations. A Mechanics' Institute was erected in 1850, at a cost of about £1,000, which in 1884 became the municipal buildings of the town and the home of the Free Library. The Conservatives have a club house in York street. A cemetery has been formed at a distance of two miles from the town. A market hall was erected in 1853, which was taken down in 1881 and the present Reform Club erected on the site. A public park, of twenty acres, was presented to the town by Her Majesty the Queen, and was publicly opened on the 2nd of August, 1879, by Colonel the Right Honourable Thomas Edward Taylor, M.P. The park was purchased and laid out with money which devolved to Her Majesty, in the right of her duchy and county palatine of Lancaster, from the estate of the late Charles Martin Newhouse, a wealthy cotton spinner of Heywood, who in 1873 was killed through a railway accident, and died intestate. The cost of the park was £11,000. The population of this place is included with the returns for HEAP, which chapelry contained in 1871 17,252 persons, and in 1881, 17,733. The population of the municipal

borough of Heywood (in which is included 2,033 in Castleton), is about 23,051.

HOOLEY BRIDGE is a small village in the township of Heap, borough of Heywood, and distant about one mile from that town. Here are the Heywood gas works.

HOPWOOD is a township in the ancient parish of Middleton, union of Bury, but adjoining Heywood, and indeed forming a large portion of the suburbs or environs of that town. This township is included in the ecclesiastical district of

BIRCH, where there is a church dedicated to St. Mary, which was consecrated in 1828; the living, a perpetual curacy, of the annual value of £238, is in the gift of the rector of Middleton. There are National and British schools, a chapel of ease, and places of worship for the Wesleyan and United Free Methodists in the township. Here is Hopwood Hall, the ancient seat of the family of Hopwood. Acreage of township, 2,043; population in 1871, 3,655, and in 1881, 4,430.
