

What happens in a TAS meeting?

The TAS meeting will normally include the school, the School Nurse and the school's Early Help social worker. It may also include other agencies who are able to provide help, such as Housing or Healthy Young Minds.

The purpose of the meeting is to share information to find the best way to help your child. As a parent you know your child and what is going on in their life better than we do and we want to work closely with you to develop a plan that helps and supports your family.

Team Around the School

What is Team Around the School (TAS)

TAS is an Early Help approach by which your school, school nurse and the school's Early Help social worker will meet to determine the best way to provide support to your child and your family.

We understand that sometimes life can be difficult for families for lots of reasons, and that this can affect your child's learning and general wellbeing.

If your school thinks that a TAS meeting is needed to help your child, they will discuss this with you and ask for your agreement to go ahead.
