I lead the SEND Support Service, which oversees projects to help education settings to become as inclusive as they possibly can. Our service co-ordinates the school guidelines for Ordinarily Available Inclusive Provision, the Inclusion Quality Mark, the SENCO network, and oversees Bury's Graduated Approach Toolkit.

Our service also supports schools through the Communities of Practice.

We work with other services across Education, Health and Social Care to provide advice and support for the inclusion of children and young people with SEND in education settings.
