| Footpath | Bury | | 1 | 2 | 561 | C.B. Boundary (nr Bast House) via Higher Sedger Hey to Walmersley Old Road. Path starts from the county borough boundary to the south - east of the reservoir near Bast House and continues south - eastwards and eastwards to the cottages approx.182m to the west of <i>Mount Pleasant Mill</i> . The path then turns north - eastwards and follows field boundaries to Higher Sedger Hey. It passes through the farm yard and on to Walmersley Old Road. As far as the cottages to the west of <i>Mount Pleasant Mill</i> the path is surfaced with stones and compressed soil. For the remainder of its length is it a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 2 | 2 | 64 | C.B Boundary (nr Bast House) to path No.1 Path starts from the county borough boundary at the north - eastern corner of the reservoir near Bast House and continues south - eastwards across the field to the junction with path No.1. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 2a | 2&4 | 788 | Junction of paths No.1 & 2 to path No.6 near pumping station. Path begins at the junction of paths Nos.1 & 2 and runs southwards down a shallow valley to the head of a stream. It then follows alongside the motorway and crosses the motorway before it finally joins path No.6 at a narrow gate near the water board pumping station. |
| Byway | Bury | | 3 | 2&4 | 288 | Path No.1 (nr cottages west of Mount Pleasant) to Walmersley Old Road (nr Lord Raglan P.H) The path starts from path no.1 at the cottages to the west of Mount Pleasant and continues south eastwards to the village green. The path then follows the north western and northern edges of the green to emerge on Walmersley Old Road approx 27m south of the Lord Raglan public house. The path is surfaced with bitmac and for 140m to Walmersley Old Road is surfaced with stone setts. |
| Byway | Bury | | 4 | 2 | 129 | Path No.3 to Walmersley Old Road The path starts from path no.3 near the village green and continues southwards and eastwards along Mount Pleasant to emerge on Walmersley Old Road. The path is surfaced with stone setts |
| Footpath | Bury | | 5 | 2&4 | 1009 | Starts from Walmersley Old Road 45.5m south of Slacks Farm at stone steps built into wall; the path continues south-east along south side of dry stone wall to a stile with stone steps. Continues south-east across the field to second stile to stone steps and on to a third similar stile at the private road to Whitewall, 27m to the west of Whitewall, there is a fourth stile on the southern side of the private road. The second, third and fourth stiles all use four rises to get over stone walls. Continues south-east to a squeezer stile beside a concrete post and wire fence and continues along the side of this fence to a point 68m north-west of the cottage at Whitewall Wood. Continues south to Longcroft where it turns west to emerge on Walmersley Old Road, 45.5m north of Longcroft House. The path is indistinct to the point near Whitewall Wood where it joins a cart track of compressed soil and stones. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 6 | 4 | 570 | Walmersley Road to Walmersley Old Road (nr longcroft house) Path starts from Walmersley Road opposite Rowlands Road and continues through the stile and eastwards along the northern side of the fence to the motorway and then continues alongside the motorway. The path terminates at the bus stop on Walmersley Old Road opposite longcroft house. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 7 | 4 | 48 | Path No.5 to C.B Boundary Path starts at path no.5 approx 91 m north of longcroft and continues north eastwards to the county borough boundary approx 9m to the west of the cottage at whitehall wood. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders, stones and compressed soil |
| Footpath | Bury | | 8 | 4 | 261 | Walmersley Old Road(nr lower sedger hey) to Baldingstone house Path starts from Walmersley Old Road at lower sedger hey and follows the accommodation road as far as the stile. Path runs in a south westerly direction until it reaches the motorway where it joins the F.P No.6. It finishes on the accommodation road at Baldingstone House. As far as path no.6 the path is a worn grass track but for the remainder of its length it is surfaced with compact cinders. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 8a | 4 | 576 | Path No.4 (nr cottages at Mount Pleasant) to path No.8 Path begins close to the southern end of a terrace of cottages at Mount Pleasant and follows a field boundary in s south westerly direction. It skirts the corner of an iron railed enclosure and bends in a south easterly direction to cross a broken stone wall at a corner of three fields. It follows the boundary of a small field, passes the end of a disused lane from lower sedger hey and meets path no.8 at an acute angle in the middle of the next field. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 9 | 4 | 80 | Stones Farm to Path No.8 Path starts from stones farm and continues south eastwards to join path no.8 approx 59m to the north of Baldingstone Close. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |
| R.U.P.P | Bury | | 10 | 4 | 129 | Baldingstone House via Ivy Cottage to Walmersley Old Road (nr Masons Arms P.H) Path starts from stile near Baldingstone House which marks the end of path no.8 and continues south eastwards past Ivy Cottage and Lilac Cottage to Walmersley Old Road approx 36m to the west of Masons Arms P.H. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 11 | 4 | 145 | Path No.10 (nr Ivy Cottage) to Ribble Drive Path starts from a stone stile on path no.10 approx 14m south of Ivy Cottage and continues south westwards diagonally across the field to emerge on Ribble Drive between nos. 57 & 59 Ribble Drive, with the exception of a short length leading on to Ribble Drive which is surfaced with concrete flags. the path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 12 | 4 | 209 | Walmersley Road to Ribble Drive Path starts from Walmersley Road opposite New Inn and besides omnibus shelter, and continues north eastwards to the footbridge and then across the field to the rear or Ribble Drive. The path then passes between nos. 13 &15 Ribble Drive to emerge on Ribble Drive. With the exception of the short length leading on to Ribble Drive which is surfaced with concrete flags, the path is a worn grass track. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 13 | 4 | 195 | Bentley Lane (nr Masons Arms P.H) to Mill Road Path starts from Bentley Lane approx 23m to the east of the Masons Arms P.H and continues southwards behind the houses on Walmersley Old Road path re starts and then continues southwards between the print works and the reservoir to Mill Road enclosed by brick wall on one side and iron railings on the other. The path is mainly surfaced with compacted cinders and compressed soil. |
| Bridleway | Bury | | 15 | 4 | 881 | Longcroft Bleach Works via Bevis Green Print Works and Cross Hall Farm to path no.20 Path starts from Bentley Lane at Longcroft Bleach Works and continues in a general south westerly direction over the motorway to the eastern bank of the reservoir north of bevis green print works. The path continues south westwards past bevis green print works, and cross hall farm, to path no.20 south of bevis green print works. Throughout its length the path is enclosed on both sides and is surfaced with compacted cinders and stones. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 16 | 4 | 145 | Bentley Lane to path no.15 Path starts from Bentley Lane at the motorway approx 68m east of no.10 Bentley Lane and continues westwards through the stile and across the field to the brook which it crosses by means of stepping stones. The path then crosses over a stile and on to path no.15. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 17 | 4 | 113 | Path No.15 (nr junction with Path No.16) to C.B Boundary Path starts from path no.14 almost opposite the junction of paths nos. 15&16 and continues north eastwards across the fields to the county borough boundary approx 110m south of longcroft bleach works. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 18 | 4 | 129 | Path No.15 to C.B Boundary Path starts from path no.15 approx 91m south of path no.17 and continues north eastwards through the gate and across the field to the county borough boundary. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 19 | 4 | 193 | Path No.15 to C.B Boundary Path starts from path no.15 near the junction with path no.18 and continues south eastwards to the county borough boundary. The path is enclosed on both sides and is surfaced with compact cinders and stones. |
| Byway | Bury | | 20 | 4 | 481 | Walmersley Old Road at Mill Road to the adopted portion of Mather Road Path starts from Walmersley Old Road and continues eastwards along MIRoad continuing so uth eastwards and southwards past edgerton house and walmersley bleach works to Mather Road except for Mill Road which is metalled, the path is surfaced with compacted cinders, stones and compressed soil. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 21 | 4 | 433 | Mather Road to Top o'th hill Farm Path starts from Mather Road beside Walmersley bleach works and follows the access road to the top 'oth' hill farm now renamed welby farm to path no.24 near the farm buildings. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders, stones and compressed soil. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 22 | 4 | 241 | Path no.20 via Walmersley Conservative Club to path no.21 Path starts from path no.20 beside Walmersley conservative club bowling green, at a stile of stone steps and continues south eastwards along the northern boundary of the club grounds, to a wooden squeezer stile - for this length the path is fenced on both sides. The path then continues across a field to the aqueduct at the head of the reservoir of Walmersley bleach works, across the aqueduct and south eastwards to join path no.21. The path is a worn grass track with cinders and stones in places. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 23 | 4 | 275 | Mather Road to Limefield Brow Path starts from Mather Road at north eastern end of Mather Row and continues southwards through two squeezer stiles and on to Limefield Brow to the east of Walmersley iron works. For the first 14m the path is surfaced with brick setts. From this length to the first stile the surface is of compacted cinders and stones. For the remainder of its length the surface is of compressed soil with cinders in places. |
| Bridleway | Bury | | 24 | 4 | 1201 | Greymont Road via Gorses Quarry, Davises and further davises to Broad Carr Path starts from Greymont Road at the junction with Milbourne Road and continues north eastwards along the eastern boundary of New Road sports to gorses quarry. The path continues northwards along the western boundary of the quarry to Davises and further davises farms. The path then turns eastwards, passing approx 45.5m to the north of top o'th hill farm, and continues eastwards to Broad Carr. From Greymont Road to the entrance of gorses quarry the path is surfaced with broken stones, having two setts channels for vehicle wheels. For the remainder of its length the surface is of compacted cinders, stones and compressed soil. A water course has cut deep channels in to the surface for the last 137m to Broad Carr. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 25 | 4 | 100 | Path No. 23 to Limefield Brow Path starts from no. 23 near the second stile and continues southwards to join the eastern end of Limefield Brow approx 27m east of the junction of Limefield Brow and Fairland Road. The path is surfaced with compressed soil. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 26 | 4 | 242 | Path No.23 to Path No.24 (nr Davies) Path starts from path no.23 immediately north of its junction with path no.25, and continues eastwards along the northern side of the field boundaries fence to path no.24 immediately to the north of Davies Farm. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 27 | 4 | 64 | Path No.21 to Path No.28 Path starts with path no.21 at the junction with path no.22 and continues north westwards across the field to path no.28. The path has a grass surface and is very indistinct. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 28 | 4 | 513 | Path No.24 to the borough Boundary Path starts from path no.24 at a squeezer stile approx 36 m north of the entrance to Further Davises and continues northwards across the field. Crossing path no.22 it continues northwards to a wooden squeezer stile and north eastwards to cross the motorway footbridge and terminate at the borough boundary. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 29 | 4 | 353 | Broad Carr to C.B Boundary (nr Gerrards Cross) Path starts from Broad Carr and continues north eastwards across walmersley golf course to the county borough boundary approx 91m south east of Gerrards Cross (club house). The path is a worn grass track |
| Footpath | Bury | | 30 | 4 | 497 | Path No. 31 to Sillinghurst (Castle Hill Road) The path passes through the farmyard and continues southwards across the field passing near a single marker stones and continuing to Sillinghurst and on to Castle Hill Road. With the exception of the section through the Broomses' farmyard the path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 31 | 4 | 384 | Broad Carr to C.B Boundary (nr Birtle Edge Farm) Path starts from Broad Carr and continues north eastwards along the north side of the southern boundary fence of walmersley golf course to a squeezer stile approx 54m to the north of Broomses - there is a notice stating "footpath" at this point. The path then turns south eastwards, following the field boundary feo approx 91m and then eastwards along Broomses farm accommodation road to the county borough boundary approx 45.5m to the west of Birtle Edge. The path is surfaced with rough grass and in places is boggy. The accommodation road portion is compacted cinders. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 32 | 4 | 32 | Path No.31 to Broomses Path starts from path no.31 approx 59 m from the county borough boundary and continues south westwards along the accommodation road the Broomses. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 33 | 4 | 930 | Broad Carr via Nineveh, Birchen Bower and Sillinghurst to C. B Boundary Path starts from Broad Carr and continues, enclosed on both sides, in a general south easterly direction past Nineveh and Birchen Bower, and then north eastwards to Sillinghurst. From Sillinghurst the path continues south eastwards to the county borough boundary. From Broad Carr to Nineveh the paths surface is soil and stones - it is poorly drained with reeds growing along much of its length. Pedestrians have diverted from the path on to land to the east to find firm ground. For the remainder of its length from Nineveh farm the path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 34 | 4 | 304 | Nineveh to Sillinghurst Path starts from path no.33 at Nineveh and continues through the farmyard and along the northern side of field boundaries in a south easterly direction to Sillinghurst. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 35 | 4 | 96 | Path No.33 (nr Sillinghurst) to C.B Boundary Path starts from path no.33 near sillinghurst and continues through a squeezer stile and north eastwards to the county borough boundary. The path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 36 | 4 | 1061 | Greymont Road via Walmersley Brick Works, South View to Cinder Hill Path starts from Greymont Road at the end of Lowes Road and continues eastwards along the accommodation road to walmersley brick works and then around the southern side of the brick works and adjacent quarry. The path then continues north eastwards, eastwards and south eastwards to South View and Cinder Hill. From Greymont Road to the walmersley brick works the path is surfaced with compacted cinders. From the brick works to the golf course a tarred macadam surface has been laid, but for the remainder of its length the path is surfaced with broken stones and compressed soil. Lowes Road to Greymont Road has been made up. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 37 | 4 | 209 | Greymont Road via Lowes to path No.36 (nr Walmersley Brick Works) Path starts from Greymont Road north of no.36 Greymont Road and continues south eastwards past Lowes farm to join path no.36 at Walmersley |
| Footpath | Bury | | 38 | 4 | 576 | Path No.24 via Hill Top (club house) to path No.36 Path starts from path no.24 approx 45.5m south of further davises and continues south eastwards along the northern boundary of gorses quarry to a squeezer stile near top o'th hill farm. Through this stile the path then continues south eastwards along the eastern boundary of gorses quarry to another squeezer stile near hill top (lowes park golf club house) and then along the accommodation road serving the club house to join path no.36 from path no.24 to the second stile the path is a worn grass track with cinders in places, but for the remainder of its length it is surfaced with broken stones and brick. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 39 | 4 | 465 | Path No.33 (nr Broad Carr) to path No.41. Path starts from path no.33 near Broad Carr and continues through a squeezer stile in stone wall and south westwards along the eastern side of the wall to a second squeezer stile. The path then continues south eastwards crossing a grassed area to the north east of Bradshaw Hill and ends on bridleway no.41, 15m north east of the access gates to Bradshaw Hill. The path is a worn grass track. (Part Diverted 12/03/2009) |
| Footpath | Bury | | 40 | 4 | 225 | Path No.36 to Clarence Recreational Ground Path starts from path no.36 and continues southwards to a stile leading in to Clarence Recreational Ground at the eastern corner of the reservoir. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. Part diverted 22/10/1999 |
| Bridleway | Bury | | 41 | 4 | 616 | Chesham Road (nr Beech Grove) via Green Bank, Chesham Green, Cinder Hill and Bradshaw Hill to path no.33 Path starts from Chesham Road near Beech Grove and continues northwards past green bank, chesham green, cinder hill and bradshaw hill to path no.33 approx 128m north east of bradshaw hill farm. The path is surfaced with broken bricks, stone and gravel and has sett channels along the southern section of its length. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 42 | 4 | 1397 | Starts from Chesham Road and continues south-east along the northern side of Beech Grove past the gatehouse to Danesmoor and then follows the eastern boundary of the grounds of Danesmoor and continues north by the M66 to meet Bridleway 41. The path continues north-east along a path fenced both sides and up some stone steps. It then continues along the east side of the field fence to a squeezer stile and continues north-east across the field to a second squeezer stile immediately to the east of Birchen Bower where the path joins Path 33. It is enclosed on both sides with hedges, walls and fences for its length up to stone steps and is surfaced with broken bricks, stones, cinders and compressed soil. For the remainder of its length the path is a worn grass track. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 43 | 4 | 1829 | Path No.36 (nr South View) Hercules Farm to C.B Boundary Path starts from no.36 approx 27 m south east of south view and continues south eastwards to the M66 and then southwards to joinF.P 42, continues on opposite side of motorway to hercules farm. The path crosses gypsy brook by a flagstone bridge and passes to the north of hercules farm, it then continues eastwards along the accommodation road to the farm to the county borough boundary. The path is surfaced with broken stone and compressed soil as far as hercules farm and becomes a worn grass track around the farm. The accommodation road is of compacted cinders and is fenced both sides. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 44 | 4 | 241 | Path No.43 (nr Hercules Farm) to path No.33 (nr Birchen Bower) Path starts from path no.32 approx 59m north east of Hercules Farm to a wooden squeezer stile and continues northwards and north westwards through a wooden squeezer stile and along the east side of post and wire fence to a stone squeezer stile, the path then continues across the field to a fourth squeezer stile on approx 109m east of Birchen Bower. At the beginning the path is a water logged area where the confluence of three streams from Gypsy Brook. A flagstone bridge marks the position of the public path but various diversions are used across the bog. The path then becomes a worn grass track in fairly good condition. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 45 | 4 | 493 | South of Gorsey Brow Farm to Path No.43 Path starts south of gorsey brow farm and runs adjacent to M66 until it reaches junction of FP42 and 43. Path branches off and continues north eastwards past gorsey brow to join path no.43 approx 91m to the west of Hercules Farm. The path is enclosed both sides with hedges and walls and is surfaced with broken stones, cinders and walls and compressed soil as far as gorsey brow farm. The public use various diversions through the woods to the east of this path which now are compressed soil tracks. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 46 | 4 | 225 | Path No.41 (nr Green Bank) to path No.42 Path starts from path no.41 approx 27m to the north west of Green Bank and continues north eastwards to path no.42 approx 45.5m to the south of the junction of paths no.42 & 45. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 47 | 4 | 288 | Swallow Drive (past Gypsy Brook Cottage) to Path No.46 Path starts from Swallow Drive and continues north west to cross Gypsy Brook approx 27m south of gypsy brook cottage and continues northwards to path no.42 approx 45.5m to the east of Danesmoor. The path is fenced on both sides and surfaced with compacted cinder to the brook crossing and broken stone, brick and compressed soil for the remainder of its length. |
| Bridleway | Bury | | 48 | 4 | 209 | Woodgate Hill Road (nr No.1) to path No.51 (nr Spring Cottages) The path starts from the adopted portion of Woodgate Hill Road approx 45.5m north east of the junction with Rochdale Old Road and continues north eastwards passing approx 23m south of hole bottom to the junction with path no.51 approx 59m south west of spring of spring cottages. The path is enclosed on both sides, being an average 5m wide, and is surfaced with broken stone and compacted cinders. |



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| Bridleway | Bury | | 49 | 4 | 209 | Path No. 48 via Hole Bottom and The Hagg to Mortuary Chapel (Unitarian) Path starts from path no.48 approx 9m to the east of No.9 Woodgate Hill Road and continues northwards, passing to the west of hole bottom and to the east of the hagg, to the mortuary chapel at the north eastern corner of the unitarian cemetry. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 50 | 4 | 111 | Path starts from path no.49 approx 23m to the north of the junction Of paths 48 and 49 and runs westwards for 56m to Meadowbrook Close. A second section runs from Inglewood Close to Ferngrove for 55m. Both sections of path run across public open space on the edge of the housing development. Part Diverted 22/10/1999. |
| And | Bury | | 51 | 4 | 96 | Path No.48 to rear of Fourth Avenue Path starts from path no.48 approx 59m to the south west of spring cottages and continues south eastwards to the rear of property fronting on to Fourth Avenue. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders. |
| Bridleway | Bury | | 52 | 4 | 177 | Woodgate Hill Road to Rough Hill Lane Path starts from Woodgate Hill Road approx 14m to the south of the vicarage and approx 18m to the north west of mayfield and continues south eastwards passing to the west of smethurst hall brick works to Rough Hill Lane. The path is 8' wide on average and is surfaced with broken stone, compacted cinders and clay. From opposite No.11 Rough Hill Lane to Rochdale Old Road the path is surfaced with brick setts. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 53 | 4 | 753 | Path No.53 via Boaredge Farm to C.B Boundary (nr Higher Elbut) Path starts from path no.52 approx 14m to the south of the vicarage and continues north eastwards along the accommodation road to boaredge farm which is enclosed by stone walls. Through the gate to boaredge farm, now missing, the path crosses the former farmyard to a stile of three timber steps approx 9m to the north of the farm outbuildings. From this stile the path continues north eastwards across the fields to a squeezer stile and on to a third squeezer stile at the county borough boundary approx 91m to the north east of higher elbut. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 54 | 4 | 241 | Path No.53 (nr Boaredge Farm) to C.B Boundary Path starts from path no. 53 at the gate to boaredge farm and crosses the former farmyard to a box shaped squeezer stile 5m south of boaredge farm house and continues north eastwards to a squeezer stile in the north corner of the field. The path continues past a stone barn to a timber squeezer stile east of a post wire fence and then along the southern and eastern side of the disused workings at Gallows Hill to the county borough boundary approx 137m to the south east of the Church Inn. The path is a worn grass track with the exception of a short length near the barn which is surfaced with rough stone. |



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| Footpath | Bury | | 55 | 4 | 129 | Path No. 54 to C.B Boundary Path starts from path No. 54 at the second squeezer stile and continues north past the barn to a wooden squeezer stile west of the post and wire fence and continues north westwards down the face of the disused quarry at Gallows Hill to the school on Castle Hill Road approx 54m to the south west of the Church Inn. The path is a worn grass track with rough stones. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 56 | 4 | 321 | Path No. 54 via path No. 53 to Chadwick Street Path starts from path no. 54 near the second squeezer stile approx 32m to the south of the stone barn and continues south eastwards to cross path no. 53 approx 91m to the north east of boaredge farm. The path then continues south eastwards across the fields to Chadwick Street. The path is worn grass track. |
| Bridleway | Bury | | 57 | 4 | 561 | Workhouse Lane (off Rochdale Road) via Broad Oak Terrace and Broad Oak Farm to Broad Oak Lane Path starts from Workhouse Lane off Rochdale Road and continues south eastwards to Broad Oak Terrace. The path turns south westwards and then north westwards from Broad Oak Lane approx 45.5m to the east of Fairfield Drive. The path is surfaced with compacted cinders, stones and compressed soil. There are tubular steel gates either side of the farmyard with a stone squeezer stile on the north side of the east gate and stone steps to a footpath around the northern post of the west gate. |
| Footpath | Bury | | 58 | 4 | 353 | Path No. 57 (nr Broad Oak Terrace) to C.B Boundary (nr Bridge Hall Mills) Path starts from path No. 57 near Broad Oak Terrace and continues south westwards to the footbridge over the river Roch approx 137m to the north east of bridge hall paper mills. The path is a worn grass track as far as the entrance to the paper mills, but for the remainder of its length it is surfaced with compacted cinders. The footbridge is constructed with steel frame and timber decking. |
