
What we've been up to

Home to School Travel Consultation

We have been working with Bury2gether to co-produce a new proposed policy for Home to School Travel for Children and Young People with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. A series of engagement sessions were held with parents/carers throughout January, during which we received valuable feedback that has been taken into consideration when drafting the proposed policy with Bury2gether.

The revised policy also takes into account the updated guidance issued by the Department for Education; **Travel to school for children of compulsory school age - January 2024.**

The main changes to the policy are:

- Clearly explaining the forms of travel assistance that may be offered to eligible children and young people. These include mileage reimbursement, personal travel budgets, transport, travel passes and independent travel training.
- Clarifying the Council's statutory duty in relation to pre-school age children, 5-16 year olds, post 16 provision and adult learners (post 19).
- Realigning the assessment for travel assistance with the current Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) process where appropriate.
- Simplifying the process for a change in circumstances (change of address, school, or the child/young person's individual needs).
- Providing additional flexibility for transport wherever possible to accommodate timetable changes or changes to the school day.

Blue Light Card provide those in the NHS, emergency services, social care sector and armed forces with an array of online and in-store discounts. Up until now, despite the best efforts of many people and organisations in our sector, Personal Assistants have been excluded from this cohort. This exclusion is partly because of a lack of awareness about the PA role and partly due to difficulties verifying employed PAs.

We contacted Blue Light Card at the back end of 2023 because wanted to try and change this. We explained why we set up <u>ILG PA</u> for employed PAs and what it already does to help recognise and support this hugely important but often undervalued workforce. We also explained the stringent verification process we have in place to identify and register new members.

As a result, I am delighted to confirm that we have now partnered with Blue Light Card - meaning ILG PA members can now register for Blue Light Card.

I am sure you will agree that this is a huge step forward for the PA workforce.

If you represent a funding body and would like to discuss how we are planning to roll this out and what you can do to support take up in your area, please don't hesitate to get in touch so we can arrange a virtual or face to face meeting.

Vision and Hearing Impairment/Deaf Education Service



The service aims to provide social activities to support secondary age pupils (11-16y) with a vision and/or hearing impairment in local authority mainstream high schools. Many CYP with a sensory impairment feel socially isolated and the 'Social HI-Eyes' Youth Group, facilitated by the Specialist staff, aims to help young people form friendships, develop skills and enjoy a wide range of social activities.

Alice Brennan, Teacher of the Deaf, is busy researching new activities for the group as we hurtle towards the spring and summer! Pottery, Alpacas, Manchester City in the Community and Manchester Museum are all in the mix but don't tell anyone just yet!

The range of activities offered is broad but due to financial constraints the Social HI-Eyes Youth Group is tasked with raising funds to offset the cost of activities. The Service also explores possible charitable funding for more expensive activities and parents are asked to make a financial contribution.
