Paediatric Physiotherapy

In 2022 the adaptive equipment company Jiraffe asked Bury to collaborate on a trial as they wanted to demonstrate the benefits of the adaptive trike in the school setting for children with disabilities. Historically the adaptive trike has been viewed as recreational and non-essential activity for children with disabilities yet for typically developing children learning to ride a bike is an integral milestone in their development. For children with disabilities there are few opportunities to meet the 20 minutes of recommended activity as adaptive equipment can be expensive, large and difficult to transport.

The trials completed in Millwood highlighted this further as the results were incredible and not only demonstrated improvements in the children's fitness, co-ordination, and strength as pre and post resting heartrates were taken as well as a 1-minute walk and a balance scale with improvement seen in all 3 areas. The trail showed how the use of adaptive trikes can change the way a child can access the world.

Jiraffe donated 2 trikes to Millwood school and due to the fantastic results, the school have purchased 4 more. As a result, we have been able to set up a trike club to cascade the opportunities to more children.

Following the success of the trikes a further 2 trikes have been donated and a loan scheme has now been set up by the physiotherapy team for families who have been identified to benefit from trailing the adaptive trike.

Hello from our newly appointed Paediatric Epilepsy Nurse -

Michael Donohoe

I have been a Paediatric Epilepsy Nurse for 10 years, working within

Rochdale. I am currently based with the Children's Community Nursing Team at Radcliffe Primary Care Centre.

Working in Bury I aim to achieve a gold standard of care for children and young people aged between 0 - 19 years of age delivering care and support around their Epilepsy needs. This will be through nurse led clinics in the community, joint consultant clinics with Paediatricians and Neurologists, home visits, telephone and virtual appointments. I will be offering bespoke advice, support and training around individuals Epilepsy whilst ensuring that care remains closer to home for our children and families and with the aim of avoiding hospital admissions.

I will be working with partner agencies such as health and education but also with the local authority, charities, and parents/ carers to ensure that the service can be one which is accessible to all and one which the borough of Bury can be proud of.



Vision and Hearing Impairment/Deaf Education Service



<u>Vision:</u> The Vision and Hearing Impairment/Deaf Education Service has had many years and multiple positive working experiences with Henshaws. **Henshaws** is a charitable service based in Trafford, which supports children and young people from birth to 18 years if they have sight loss, and birth to 25 years if they have additional disabilities: <u>https://www.henshaws.org.uk/sight-loss-support-team/children-young-people-families/</u>

The service provides opportunities for children and young people to develop their independence skills through the "I Can Do It" residential programme, and social activities and opportunities for the whole family that usually take place during school holidays and on weekends.

The service also offers information, advice and guidance on a one-to-one basis, and can signpost or refer families to other organisations if needs be. Families can self-refer via the link below:

Hearing: The Vision and Hearing Impairment/Deaf Education Service is involved with the Children's Hearing Services Working Groups (**CHSWG**s). The group ensures that the services for deaf children and their families in your area work together to provide the best support possible. They are based in health authority areas in England. Parents of deaf children, as well as any other service users, and professionals who provide services for deaf children, such as teachers of the deaf, audiologists, and speech and language therapists, all attend many CHSWG meetings along with the NDCS.

The group aims to:

- Ensure a coordinated successful delivery of high-quality services for hearing impaired children and their families.
- Develop the service and look at issues associated with successful service delivery.
- Ensure a high quality seamless family friendly service.
- Monitor and improve services for hearing impaired children and their families.
- Support the development of local policies in keeping with national, regional and local guidelines.
- To raise awareness of hearing impairment and the services required.

Speech and Language Therapy Team

The Speech and Language Therapy team are delighted with the success of the school service pilot and are pleased to be extending this to another 25 primary schools over the Autumn term, followed by the remaining 20 primary schools in the Spring term. Each school will have a named Speech and Language Therapist. Children will no longer need to be brought out of school to attend clinic and they will benefit from being seen in their everyday environment. It will ensure greater partnership working between Speech and Language Therapy and school staff. We have several options to ensure parents are kept informed and involved in their child's care. There will be a new referral pathway for primary schools that will reduce waiting times.

The Bury Speech Sound Screen Toolkit and Resource packs successfully launched this year. As part of the launch, staff from the Bury Paediatric Speech and Language Therapy team have been training school and nursery staff on how to support children's speech sound development. The training focused on strategies that can be used throughout the day in school/nursery.

The team are also working hard to support development of areas of the Bury Early Years Speech, Language and Communication pathway, with a focus on targeted support for children aged 18 months – 3 years with emerging speech, language, and communication needs. The team have also been working with partners across Greater Manchester to help improve speech, language and communication activity sheets for parents and carers.

"We are excited to announce the start of our new training pathway to provide support and education for all matters speech, language, and communication for those working with school age children. The courses are free and are open for anyone to attend including parents and professionals. These courses will be delivered online. Please find below a list of the courses running this academic year:

Tuesday 10th October – Introduction to Speech Language and Communication – KS1 & 2

Tuesday 14th November – Speech Sound difficulties and using the speech sound screen.



Bee Inclusive is hosting the above Early Years sessions for children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) aged 0-5 years and their parent/carers. The sessions will be filled with lots of fun and educational activities.

These sessions are facilitated by Kelly Judd (Senior Portage Worker) and Laura Trevor (SEND Health Visitor) with support from other professionals and volunteers who will be available for advice and support. Refreshments will be available, and the Sensory Room and sensory courtyard will be open for use. A parent/carer must stay and supervise their child at all times.

To be considered for a place, you must meet the following criteria:

- Is your child 0-5 years old?
- Does your child live in (or access) services in Bury?
- Do any of the following apply? 1) Does your child have a diagnosis of SEND? 2) Do you or professionals suspect that your child has SEND? 3) Is your child on the pathway for a SEND diagnosis?

Please note: In order to allocate places on these sessions, professionals will prioritise children who are not in an early years setting, who are not currently accessing early years services, children who cannot access generic early help sessions, and those who haven't attended our sessions before.

Around 1.4 million children in the UK have long term speech, language and communication needs (SLCN) that they won't grow out of. That equates to around 10% of children - **two or three in every classroom**.

Good communication skills are linked to achievement and life chances. Unsupported speech and language delays affect attainment, learning, literacy, social relationships, behavior, mental health and ultimately employment and social mobility.

Autism Education Trust's (AET) Schools Professional Development Programme with OakLP Outreach



- Over 1 in 100 people are autistic and the number of children receiving an autism diagnosis is rising. In Bury we have 430 young people currently on the autism pathway (CAMHS, 2023)
- Seven in ten autistic children and young people said school would be better if more teachers understood autism. (NAS education report, 2023)
- 61% of teacher surveyed had less than 1/2 days autism training
- The current waiting time for an initial assessment for neurodevelopment is 14 months, the waiting time from point of referral to diagnosis is around 2 years (Bury CAMHS, 2023).

OakLP are working with the Local Authority and Health to support the graduated approach and increase awareness of autism and how to support young learners effectively.
