



Service update for Inclusion and SEN Support.

As part of the phase two Children's Services restructure, Inclusion Service will be ceasing to operate in its current form from 31st August 2023. It will be replaced by a new SEND Support Service, supporting education settings to develop policy and practice at SEN Support. The SEND Support Service will be complimented by a new Outreach Team, working with schools through a consultation approach to provide advice for children and young people at SEN Support. The Outreach Team will also support schools with the implementation of the Graduated Approach Toolkit.

On 1st September 2023, a new SEND Support Service page will be launched on the Local Offer providing further information and contact details. The Service will continue to head up the revision of the Local Offer in co-production with all Bury's partners and will also oversee the continuing development of the Graduated Approach Toolkit.

Bury CAMHS drop-in sessions.

Bury CAMHS has offered the drop in every Monday afternoon for all Bury young people, children and families over the summer. There has been some uptake of families and young people, and we have also had a couple of professionals attend to see what we are up to. However, attendance has sadly not been what we would have liked, and we will review this offer after our last drop-in session (the 4^{th of} September.) It may be that we feel after reviewing this that there is more demand for a drop in during the school term time. We will keep you updated regarding this.

Consultation Line

We recommend that professionals consider utilising the CAMHS consultation lime if they are unsure about what we offer or would like advice on what information is needed when making a referral.

The CAMHS link team are available to answer questions and give advice on the professional's consultation line every Friday between 1-5pm. The contact number for the consultation line is 07912 453942.

The aim of the consultation line is to support Bury professionals working with children and young people with a shared decision-making opportunity: implementing the Thrive model. The goal is this will help professionals fully consider the most appropriate support to meet the needs of the young person they are involved working with.





Invitation to take part in an online focus group to shape Bury's SEND Strategy

Bury Council and local partners are working to identify the outcomes that matter to children and young people with SEN or disabilities to inform the planning and delivery of services and the monitoring of how well services have secured those outcomes. The council want to hear the views of parent/carers of children and young people with SEND.

The Council for Disabled Children (CDC) have been asked to run the sessions, so they are independent and provide an open forum for all to share their views. The sessions will be led by CDC staff.

The sessions will be open conversations which will cover three main questions:

- What should a good life look like for a child or young person with SEND in Bury?
- Do the 7 outcomes identified reflect the lives of children and young people with SEND in Bury?
- How should the 7 outcomes be improved?

There will be two of the same sessions held on Thursday, 14th of September. The sessions will be at: - 10.00-11.30 - 18.00-19.30



What is SEN SUPPORT?

Advice & Support Service.

Children and young people with SEN (special educational needs) have learning difficulties and/or disabilities that make it harder for them to learn than most children and young people of the same age. They may need extra or different help from that given to others however some will need extra support for some or all of their time in education and training.

Children and Families Act 2014

The Equality Act 2010

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Code of Practice 0-25 years (SEND Code of Practice 2015)

Section 6.27 - 6.35 of the SEND Code of Practice sets out the four broad areas of need:

- Communicating and interacting
- Cognition and learning
- Sensory and/or physical needs
- Social, emotional, and mental health difficulties

Section 6:44 of the SEND Code of Practice

states that - Where a pupil is identified as having SEN, schools should take action to remove barriers to learning and put effective special educational provision in place. This SEN support should take the form of a four-part cycle through which earlier decisions and actions are revisited, refined, and revised with a growing understanding of the pupil's needs and of what supports the pupil in making good progress and securing good outcomes. This is known as the graduated approach. It draws on more detailed approaches, more frequent reviews, and more specialist expertise in successive cycles to match interventions to the SEN of children and young people.



What does SEN support look like? Schools should use some of their budget (upto £6000) to make provisions for children who need additional help. This could look like:





technology





Quiet space to learn and work



Changes to curriculum



Additional support in the classroom



Small group work

How can I find out what support my child is getting?

- Speak to your child's teacher and SENCO
- You can ask for a copy of any support plan in place i.e. IEP (Individual learning plan), IEP (Individual Education Plan), Pupil Passport or a provision map.

WHO IS THIS SERVICE FOR?

Appointments are available for children and young people who have SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) and live in Bury

WHY CHOOSE BEE INCLUSIVE?

We only cut one child/young person's hair at a time, and the haircut also takes place in a private room. The Bury SEND Hub is designed with SEND children in mind, from the neutral décar so as not to overstimulate to the fully accessible toilet/changing facilities. WHO WILL BE CUTTING MY CHILDS HAIR?

We have enlisted the help of an excellent professional hairdresser called Chlae. Who is not only a proud parent of a child with SEND but also an experienced PA for a child with SEND. We are very excited to have her on board as she will bring all of her experience, warmth and patience to your

WHAT CAN WE BOOK IN FOR?

Our standard appointment is for a dry cut, but if there is time left in your appointment slot, our hairdresser would happily offer your child some extras to fill that time, perhaps braids or curls.

YOUR APPOINTMENT



CHECK-IN

Feel free to use the Bee Inclusive 'Now and Next' board with your child, which has been designed to help them understand the sequence of their appointment.



PLAY & PREPARE

You and your child will wait in our main function room, where there will be toys to play with whilst your child waits for their slot, along with head massagers to help your child relax and desensitize their head.



You and your child will go into a private room for your appointment. You can let a staff member know what will help you and your child feel comfortable, and we will adjust the surroundings accordingly. For example, we could put on their favourite music or make the room darker and keep



RELAX & REWARD

Your child will get 15 minutes of play in our private sensory room to reward and help regulate their emotions and senses before leaving the building. They will also receive a special 'I had my hair cut at Bee Inclusive' sticker



Bee Inclusive is hosting the above Early Years sessions for children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) aged 0-5 years and their parent/carers. The sessions will be filled with lots

Stay & Plays will be followed by informal Early Years Care & Convo sessions where parent/carers

These sessions are facilitated by Kelly Judd (Senior Portage Worker) and Laura Trevor (SEND Health Visitor) with support from other professionals and volunteers who will be available for advice and support. Refreshments will be available, and the Sensory Room and sensory courtyard will be open for use. A parent/carer must stay and supervise their child at all times.

To be considered for a place, you must meet the following criteria:

- Is your child 0-5 years old?Does your child live in (or access) services in Bury?
- Do any of the following apply? 1) Does your child have a diagnosis of SEND? 2) Do you or
 professionals suspect that your child has SEND? 3) Is your child on the pathway for a SEND

Please note: In order to allocate places on these sessions, professionals will prioritise children who are not in an early years setting, who are not currently accessing early years services, children who cannot access generic early help sessions, and those who haven't attended our sessions before."

SEND Family Santa Special 2023

Join Father Christmas, his happy helpers and other festive characters on a voyage through the Irwell Valley. You will enjoy all the magic and wonder of our Santa Specials with a few tweaks here and there to make it more accessible. Begin your adventure at Bury Bolton Street Station and enjoy the atmosphere and decorations before boarding your train. Characters will be wandering the platform to wave hello or even stop for a chat and a photo if you like!

Once on board and settled into your seat, a steam train will haul you to Ramsbottom and back on an approximately 80-minute round trip. On the way you'll meet more Christmassy characters and have the option to listen to a live brass band. Before long Santa himself will visit your carriage with a gift for every little one.

What Makes the event SEND friendly?

To make the event as welcoming and comfortable as possible to children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, the SEND Family Santa Special will feature:

A Quieter Experience: Reduced musical volume and visual stimuli, toned down characters, and no flashing lights ensures that your visit will not be overwhelming.

Alternative Access: Don't want to cross the footbridge? No problem! Chaperoned outdoor access will be provided for those that wish to make use of it.

Wider Arrival Window: No need to rush. Your train will be waiting on the platform for an extended period prior to departure. Board when you want to.

Special Calm Carriages: Calm Carriages A & G will offer a quieter experience, and not include a live performance from the Brass Band.

Tell Us What You're Comfortable With: Facility to tell our performers what level of interaction you are happy with.

An Accessible Coach: Offering accommodation for 2 wheelchairs and 6 accompanying people.

Carers Book Online: One registered carer can travel for free for each paying passenger needing assistance. You can book these tickets online. Please bring ID on the day.

A Quick Exit: Following your train ride, use our quick exit from the platform to avoid passengers arriving for the next departure.

The Fed is a social care charity which supports 1 in 7 Jewish homes and over 6,500 people every year across Greater Manchester, and 150 residents and tenants at Heathlands Village – its care home for older people.

Our Summer Playscheme 2023

August at The Fed's Children's Centre was wonderfully busy with the charity's Summer Play Camp for children with additional needs taking place over four weeks.

The camp had a different theme each week - Seaside, Exercise and Sports, Circus and finally Pets and other Animals – allowing a huge variety of sensory and other experiences for its participants.



The youngsters had a ball under the safe supervision of The Fed's play leaders and experienced, talented team of Community Workers and trained Fed Volunteers.

For children with developmental, physical, or behavioural challenges, attending a regular summer-camp alongside their brothers and sisters is not always possible; but centre provided them with fantastic, fun-filled opportunities and support in forming friendships, learning life skills, and taking part in a whole assortment of meticulously planned, summer play activities.

On top of this, the camp gave parents and carers a chance to switch off and recharge or give their attention to their other children, with complete peace of mind.

The camp is partially funded by the Bury and Salford Council Holiday Activities & Food funding and Salford Short Breaks funding.
