Deborah leads our improvement journey

Hello, my name is Deborah Glassbrook and I have the amazing job of chairing the monthly SEND Improvement and Assurance Board often referred to as SAIB.

I have worked with and on behalf of children for 46 years starting my career as a nurse working with children, young people and adults who had significant additional needs and lived in a hospital.

I was a Social Worker for 40 years and had a wonderful time doing a whole range of jobs including setting up a MENCAP respite home, working for the BBC and becoming the first Deputy Director of ChildLine, being a Child Protection Chair and Independent Reviewing Officer, working as a Research Fellow at the University of Bristol and being a Director of Children's Services.

I now have my own consultancy called Optimising Potential Limited – called that because that is what I believe passionately about – optimising the potential of children, of young people, of their families, of teams and services and organisations and of local areas.

I will explain what the SIAB is but first need to explain about what happened leading up to there being a SIAB.

In February 2024 Bury Local Area had an Area SEND inspection undertaken by the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and



Skills (Ofsted) and the Care Quality Commission (CQC). You can find out more about the inspection by reading the inspection framework Area SEND inspections: framework and handbook - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/area-send-framework-and-handbook

The outcome of the inspection was that' there are widespread and/or systemic failings leading to significant concerns about the experiences and outcomes of children and young people

with special educational needs and/or disabilities, which the local area partnership must address urgently.'

As a result of the inspection, the Local Area Partnership had to prepare and submit a Priority Impact Plan to address the 6 priority areas and 3 areas for improvement outlined in the report – you can read the inspection report by clicking on here <a href="https://www.bury.gov.uk/social-care-and-support/child-care-and-support/child-care-and-support/child-care-and-support/child-care-with-disabilities/bury-send-local-offer/burys-improvement-journey-information/burys-improvement-journey-information which will take you to the Local Offer.

Improvement Notice

Bury also received what is called an Improvement Notice issued by the Department of Education.

The Improvement Notice under section 5 says 'the council must ensure there is an improvement board, with an independent chair agreed by the Department.'

I had been doing some work supporting Leaders in Bury before the inspection as part of my role as a SEND Improvement Advisor with the Local Government Association and was asked to be the Chair of the improvement board as soon as the inspection outcome was known. I had no hesitation in agreeing.

SIAB is attended by key leaders across Education, Health, the council and Bury2gether as well as young people and this group of people are responsible for providing strategic system and partnership leadership, assurance and oversight of the 6 priority impact areas and 3 area of improvement so that improvements will be made, at pace.

The SAIB members need to make sure that any barriers to progress are identified, building on what is working well and improving what is not. The SIAB members use the Priority Impact Plan to track who should be doing what and by when and has regular reports from the leads of the 6+3.

We have notes of the SIAB meetings which are shared on the Local Offer so please have a look at those to find out more about what has been discussed at each of the meetings – we have had 3 meetings so far in June, July and August.

I hope that what I have written about is helpful and interesting – thank you for taking the time to read it.

I am looking forward to sharing more about the work of the SIAB over the coming months.

EHC Assessment and Review Team update

As you will be aware, the Local Authority is subject to a Priority Impact Plan (PIP), which outlines our areas of improvement, following our most recent Local Area SEND Inspection.

The EHC Assessment and Review Team is committed to contributing to this improvement to make sure that we improve service delivery and most importantly the lived experiences of our children, young people with additional needs and our families.

We continue to improve our timeliness of issuing new EHC Plans within the 20 week period and we are now focused on improving our Annual Review process so our families see a prompt response following a formal review of an EHC Plan.

We are pleased to share that additional

resource has been secured and agreed to build capacity in the team to deliver this and recruitment procedures are now underway. We have also set out a core training and development plan for all staff.

We understand how important communication is for our families and professionals so have developed a duty line, as a first step to improving this.

Calls will continue to reach the general enquiry line (0161 253 5969) and Coordinators and Assistants will continue to respond to the enquiries, wherever possible.

If you need to speak to your assigned officer and are unable to reach them, you will be offered contact from the duty officer the same day.

Inclusion and Outreach Teams

The vision for Inclusion and SEND in Bury is that there is a well understood and deliverable SEND Support and Outreach offer, aligning with Bury's strategic objectives, and which helps to support some of our local area challenges.

The offer for Inclusion and Outreach teams has been revised for this academic year and includes the collaboration with Oak Learning Partnership and the Educational Psychology Service.

The rational for these developments is that services will work more closely together to compliment each other's offers and to provide a more comprehensive approach to supporting schools and the community.



School & College Transport Team

The start of the new school year has been an exceptionally busy period for the team as we continue to plan travel arrangements for the new academic year.

We have successfully recruited to the vacant Travel Co-ordinator posts. Jack Burney and Marie Tedros joined the team at the start of September and are busy settling into their new roles. I'm sure many of you will speak with them over the coming months.

From September, we have been providing travel assistance to 594 children & young people and have introduced 16 new routes for the academic year.

Unfortunately, three pupil escorts resigned from their role over the summer holiday and at the start of September we were operating 13 transport routes without a pupil escort in place.

Job adverts have been consistently advertised between June and September and several staff have been appointed and allocated to their route during September. All vacancies are advertised on Greater Jobs;

Bury - Home | greater.jobs

From Monday 28 October the number of routes operating without a pupil escort will reduce to 6 plus 1 route requiring cover for afternoons only. One pupil escort is due to commence their employment on Monday 28

October and will be allocated to their permanent route following two weeks mandatory training. A further three candidates are awaiting finalisation of recruitment checks.

The team manage a small pool of relief pupil escorts, whilst the recruitment process is ongoing relief staff will be allocated wherever possible to accompany the pupils on their journey to and from school.

We will always try to provide cover for pupil escort sickness and vacant routes however, there are occasions where this is not possible. Some contractors are providing spare drivers to act as escorts, however it is not always possible to allocate an escort at such short notice.

We continue to prioritise recruitment. The team appreciates that the cancellation of transport is difficult for the children and their families, cancellations will only be made as a last resort when all other options have been explored. In the event of a cancellation the team will endeavour to contact families as soon as possible to allow as much time for alternative arrangements to be put in place.

Rather than cancel transport for the whole day, wherever possible if cover can be found for the morning or afternoon, parents/carers are asked to make alternative arrangements for the other journey, which hopefully lessens the impact for families.

Children's ADHD public engagement exercise launch

NHS Greater Manchester wants to improve children's Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) services and would like to hear from you.

NHS GM has launched a public engagement exercise to gather views about children and young people's attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) services. (go to https://gmintegratedcare.org.uk/children s-adhd-services/)

We want children and young people to have timely access to support that is tailored to helping them to manage their ADHD condition and symptoms, considering their needs as a whole and not focusing on their diagnosis.

The engagement exercise, which runs until Friday 29 November 2024, seeks to address some of the issues including long wait times, levels of ongoing support for patients, the assessment process, and how services vary across Greater Manchester.

Our biggest priority is to improve how cases are prioritised, and making sure that children and young people who are most in need get help fastest.

We have expanded our myHappymind offer across all schools in Bury and many of the schools have taken this up.

myHappymind currently supports currently more than 12 thousand children in primary schools and the feedback we are getting from children's parents and staff is amazing.

We are also launching our teen offer in September and the programme will be available in secondary settings in Bury. During a recent visit to Chapelfield Primary School we saw it in action. The schools' children, staff and environment highlighted to us how this programme is providing such a wealth of support to every pupil in the school.

We met with the Happiness Champions and wider school population as they progressed through their myHappymind lessons.

Staff fully embed the programme across other curriculum areas to help set goals and to encourage better listening skills. They also use the resources outside of the set time scales to centre and calm the children prior to lessons.

Feedback from children, teachers and special educational needs co-ordinators across Bury includes:

"When I am feeling sad or stressed, I use Happy Breathing to calm me down."

"I understand my emotions better"

"It's a peaceful thing to learn and helps with my well-being by putting me in a good mood."

Head Teacher feedback

"myHappymind has definitely had a positive impact on the emotional and mental health of our children in school since we have been on our journey with the programme.

"Children now have a good understanding of their brains and what constitutes good mental health.

"It is now more common for children to talk about what it means to be dysregulated and use the language of Team H-A-P to help talk about their emotions and how to regulate. "

Teacher feedback

"The children feel calm when they do Happy Breathing.

"They have also learnt that mistakes help our brain to grow and learn, and they use this throughout all lessons as a reminder.

"They better understand their brain and how their feelings are working."

Special educational needs co-ordinators feedback

"As the Year 3 teacher, co-ordinator and designated mental health lead, I see the impact of using such a structured and practical scheme.

"myHappymind has supported us to be research-informed and on the cutting edge of providing children with the language to verbalise their emotions, understand their feelings and visibly support their regulation.

"The difference in our children and the calm is palpable."

Health Visitor increase


