WHAT DO WE DO?



Young people from 8 years+ can be referred into the service by any professional working with them. Young people and parents can also refer.

We work with young people who have been identified as being at risk of criminality, to offer holistic assessments and create plans tailored to meet their needs. This includes 121 direct work, group activity and specialised support.

The voice of the parent and young person is embedded into plans and relationships are formed to ensure young people are supported, and diverted, from criminal activity to reach full potential.

A multi-agency approach with effective information sharing and partnership working informs practice to improve and increase support.

ELIGIBILITY



Eligibility for Youth Offending Prevention support is:

- Clear evidence that a young person is on the cusp of offending.
- Evidence of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)
- GMP Intelligence
- Not open to Youth Justice, Complex Safeguarding or on a pathway to access their support

Eligibility for Harmful Sexual Behaviour Work is:

A young person who has been discussed at a HSB strategy meeting who meets the threshold for Intervention.

A young person who has had a welfare AIM assessment completed and intervention proposed.

TURNAROUND



Turnaround is a Government scheme operating across all Local Authorities to offer an early help approach to prevention. In Bury this enhances our youth offending prevention offer, enabling us to do **even more** to support young people.

Children aged 10-17 who fit one or more of the following criteria are eligible for Turnaround:

- those who are interviewed under caution following arrest or subject to a criminal investigation attending a voluntary interview.
- those who are subject to No Further Action (NFA) decision (including Outcome 22).
- those who are subject to a Community Resolution (Outcome 8).
 - those receiving a first-time youth caution, not including conditional caution.
- released under investigation (RUI) or those subject to pre-charge bail (PCB).
 - those discharged by a court; those acquitted at court; and/or those fined by a court.
