


HOUSING WAITING LIST ANALYSIS AND DEMAND JANUARY 2022

1. Dwellings owned by Bury Council

As at 14th January 2021 there are:

- 7,524 properties owned by Bury Council and managed by Six Town Housing (STH).
- 103 properties owned and managed by Six Town Housing
- 291 properties owned by Bury Council and managed by Springs TMO. These are excluded from this report as the properties are let through Springs direct and not through Bury Home Options. Springs also hold their own housing register.

Figure 1: Number of Bury Council owned dwelling




Number of Bury Council owned dwellings

The largest proportion of properties is in Bury East with 30%, followed by Radcliffe with 26%.

2. Properties Advertised and Bids Placed

From the period 1st January 2021 to 31st December 2021, 488 properties have been advertised through Bury Home Options, the Council's Choice Based Lettings system and 21,934 bids have been placed on them. This includes properties owned by Six Town Housing.

Through the nominations agreement we advertise Housing Association (HA) properties through Bury Home Options. In this report 190 HA (39%) properties were advertised which 7,749 bids had placed on them. It should be noted that there have been a number of new developments by Housing Associations, we only advertise one of each property type per development for customers to bid on.

3. Bury East

There are 2,304 council and STH owned dwellings in Bury East. 94 properties were available for bidding on Bury Home Options. Of these 14 were nominations from Housing Associations. 7,622 bids were placed in total.

There are 819 council and STH owned dwellings in Bury West. 32 properties were available for bidding on Bury Home Options. Of these 4 were nominations from Housing Associations. 1,366 bids were placed in total.

5. Prestwich

There are 1,029 council and STH owned dwellings in Prestwich. 72 properties were available for bidding on Bury Home Options. Of these 54% (39 properties) were nominations from Housing Associations. 2,321 bids were placed in total.

Housing Association properties in St. Marys provided the most available properties with 16 (HA properties are not available at estate level). By estate Prestwich Central had the most properties available. 11 of the 12 available properties are located in the retirement schemes in the area. The property in Polefield had the most bids with 106, this is a 3 bed house. Bent Hill provided the only 4 bed property that was available in 2021, this was a adapted property.

6. Radcliffe

There are 2,003 council and STH owned dwellings in Radcliffe. 128 properties were available for bidding on Bury Home Options. Of these 55 were nominations from Housing Associations. 5,684 bids were placed in total.

7. Ramsbottom

There are 584 council and STH owned dwellings in Ramsbottom. Ramsbottom has the least number of properties with only 8% of the stock. 30 properties were available for bidding on Bury Home Options. Of these 7 were nominations from Housing Associations. 1,019 bids were placed in total.

8. Whitefield

There are 888 council and STH owned dwellings in Whitefield. 95 properties were available for bidding on Bury Home Options. Of these 41 (43%) were nominations from Housing Associations. 3,922 bids were placed in total. Whitefield had the highest average bid per property with 57.


Although 1 bed properties had the highest number of bids, the average number of bids for 3 bed family homes was the highest with 128 per available property.

9. Waiting List

Between 1st January and 31st December 2021 the Council received 5,013 new housing applications. This is an average of 96 per week. As at 14th January 2022 there were 1,531 live applications on the housing register.

Demand for social housing continues to outstrip the number of properties available, as seen in the data above, and it is up to the Council to ensure that there remains fair and equitable access to what has become a scarce resource. The law requires the Council to give 'reasonable preference' to certain groups of people and this is reflected in the Council's Housing Allocation Policy.


Figure 3: Number of applications by reasonable preference (Band)



Although band 3 has the most applicants, band 4, one bedroom overcrowded is the priority with the most applicants with 310. Followed by band 3, medium medical need, with 207.

49% of applications on the housing waiting list require a 1 bedroom property. Analysis above shows that of the available properties advertised through Bury Home Options 308 (63%) were 1 bed properties. Although the Council do not own any 5 bedroom properties applicants with a 5 bed need may bid on larger 4 bed properties with an additional downstairs reception room. This additional room may be used as a bedroom.

Figure 5: Gender of main applicant:



The majority of applicants on the housing waiting list are single people. Of the 449 single applicants **without** children, 174 were female and 275 were male. However, of the 457 single people **with** children 421 (92%) were female with only 36 being male.

The largest age range of the main applicant is between 25 and 44. The oldest applicant is 100 years old. The average age of applicants is 42.

The demand for social housing in Bury is very high and applicants maybe waiting a considerable time before being rehoused. Applicants maybe waiting longer for adapted properties or if they are only willing to consider a property in a particular location.

Figure 6: Average waiting time (in days) on register




Figure 6 above shows the average waiting time by bedrooms required. It can be seen that applicants could be waiting a year for a one bed property.

Other housing options need to be considered when apply for housing such as housing associations and private rented properties. The council cannot fulfil the demand for housing within their own stock.
